With 8,025 employees, the University is the second-largest employer in Washoe County. Including indirect (supplier) and induced (employee spending) impact, the University's estimated annual economic impact is \$1.34 billion and supports more than 11,000 jobs. The University produces more than 5,100 globally competitive graduates each year.

WNC is a comprehensive community college serving 5,000 students annually over a six-county area of more than 12,000 square miles. Based in Carson City, WNC's scenic main campus sits on the eastern edge of the Sierra Nevada mountain range. Additional campuses are in Fallon and Minden with outreach centers in the smaller communities of Dayton, Fernley, Silver Springs, Smith Valley and Yerington.

Since 1971, WNC has offered high quality, affordable higher education to prepare students to transfer, earn degrees, and contribute to the workforce. The college offers four- and two-year degrees, as well as certifications, in a variety of areas including advanced manufacturing, business, computer technology, deaf studies, nursing, paramedicine, construction, graphic design and welding. WNC's innovative approach brings workforce training to rural students through the Commercial Driver's License (CDL) training program and the Mobile Manufacturing classroom. The college's robust dual-enrollment program (Jump Start) allows students to earn their associate's degrees while still in high school. The Carson City Campus houses the Jack C.
