5. RELEASE OF EASEMENT LOCATED AT 1701 BUCKEYE ROAD, MINDEN, NV – WNC

FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

Western Nevada College President J. Kyle Dalpe will request approval to release the easement located at 1701 Buckeye Road, Minden, Nevada, Assessor Parcel Number 1320-27-002-033. In consideration of the abandonment of this easement, the Western Nevada College Foundation will receive an endowment of \$50,000 to benefit students. President Dalpe further requests that he or his designee be granted authority to finalize and execute the release of the easement, any non-material, or corrective amendments thereto, and any other ancillary agreements or documents that may be required to implement the release of the easement. Any such amendments and ancillary documents shall be reviewed and approved by the NSHE Chief General Counsel, or at the NSHE Chief General Counsel's request, NSHE Special Real Property Counsel, to confirm that they are necessary to implement the terms and conditions required to finalize the release of the easement as approved by the Board of Regents. 6. TRANSFER OF THE HIGH TECH CENTER TO CARSON CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT – WNC

FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

Western Nevada College President J. Kyle Dalpe will request approval to transfer property rights in its High Tech Center, a building on a small parcel located on the campus of Carson High School, created through legislation in the late 1990s. The proposed transfer is to the Carson City School District. President Dalpe further requests that the Chancellor be authorized to execute the transfer agreement and deed, any non-material, or corrective amendments thereto, and any other ancillary agreements or documents that may be required to implement the transfer. Any such amendments and ancillary documents shall be reviewed and approved by the NSHE Chief General Counsel, or at the NSHE Chief General Counsel's request, NSHE Special Real Property Counsel, to confirm that they are necessary to implement the terms and conditions required to finalize the transfer of the High Tech Center as approved by the Board of Regents. 7. FIFTH AMENDMENT TO INTERLOCAL MEDICAL OFFICE LEASE BETWEEN UNLV AND UNIVERSITY MEDICAL CENTER OF SOUTHERN NEVADA FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 1524 PINTO LANE, LAS VEGAS, NV – UNLV

FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

University of Nevada, Las Vegas President Keith E. Whitfield will request approval of the Fifth Amendment to Interlocal Medical Office Lease with University Medical Center of Southern Nevada for property located at 1524 Pinto Lane, Las Vegas, NV, which is located on a portion of Clark County Assessor Parcel Number 139-33-305-023. President Whitfield will further request that the Chancellor be granted authority to execute the Fifth Amendment to Interlocal Medical Office Lease, and any ancillary documents deemed necessary and appropriate by the NSHE Chief General Counsel, or at the Chief General Counsel's request, NSHE Special Real Property Counsel, to implement all terms and conditions of the Lease and Amendments. FISCAL IMPACT: The total cost of the Fifth Amendment is estimated to be \$327,291.12 and the lease payments will be funded by UNLV Health by means of revenue generated from its clinical operations.

8. LONG-TERM LEASE AGREEMENT WITH OMNINET 3300 SAHARA, LLC ON BEHALF OF THE KIRK KERKORIAN SCHOOL OF MEDICINE FOR USE OF SPACE AT 3300 WEST SAHARA AVENUE, LAS VEGAS, NV – UNLV

FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

University of Nevada, Las Vegas President Keith E. Whitfield will request approval of the long-term Lease Agreement with Omninet 3300 Sahara, LLC, on behalf of the UNLV Kirk Kerkorian School of Medicine at 3300 W. Sahara Avenue, bearing Clark County Assessor Parcel Number 162-05-402-011 and a portion of parcel 162-05-402-010. President Whitfield will further request that the Chancellor be granted authority to execute the Lease Agreement, any amendments, and any other ancillary agreements required to implement the Lease Agreement. All aforementioned agreements shall be reviewed and approved by the NSHE Chief General Counsel, or at the Chief General Counsel's request, NSHE Special Real Property Counsel, in order to implement the terms and conditions required to finalize the Lease Agreement. FISCAL IMPACT: Under the Lease Agreement, total costs for the ten-year Term are estimated to be \$12,594,404.10. Lease payments for the Premises will be funded by UNLV Health by means of revenue generated from its clinical operations.
