It was established in 2005 to meet the training needs of Southern Nevada's workforce and employers. The Division works with the region's business and key industry sectors in the assessment, design and implementation of customized curricula and training programs. It also provides services to students, employers, employees and adult learners seeking education opportunities, new skills and career advancement.

Program Details

Students must be 18 years or older and possess either a high school diploma or GED equivalent.

Apprenticeship programs can be 2 to 5 years in length depending on trade.

An apprentice will attend classes at the JATC and be placed on a jobsite by the trade.

JATC Trust

↓ A committee made of union and contractor representatives that oversee the Apprenticeship Program.

Director/Coordinator

↓ Manages and runs the apprenticeship program, ensuring students are being taught both in the classrooms and out in the field.

Instructor

↓ Teaches the apprentices of the trade through lecture and hand on training.
