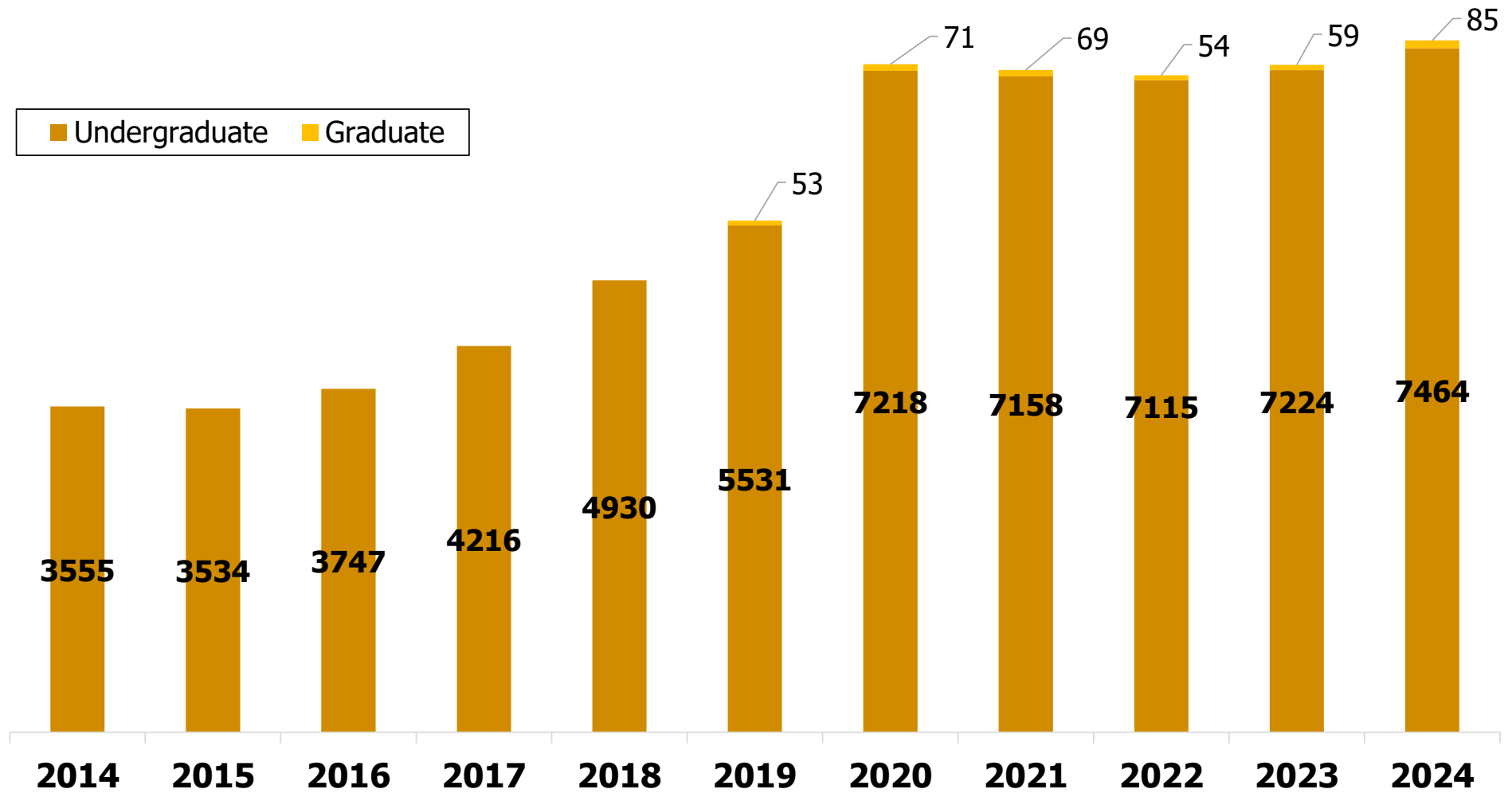
NSU's New Majority: Jessica

- Pursuing BSN in Nursing

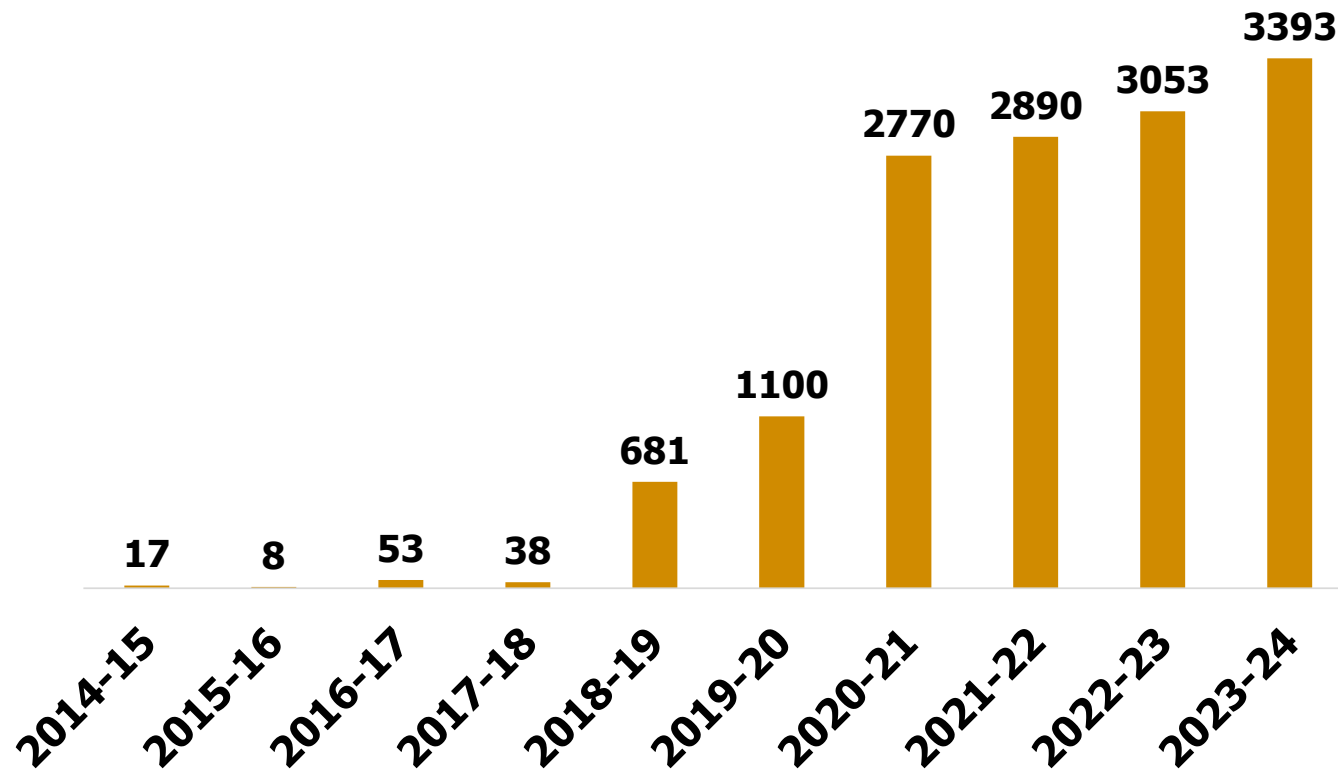

Dual Credit Enrollment

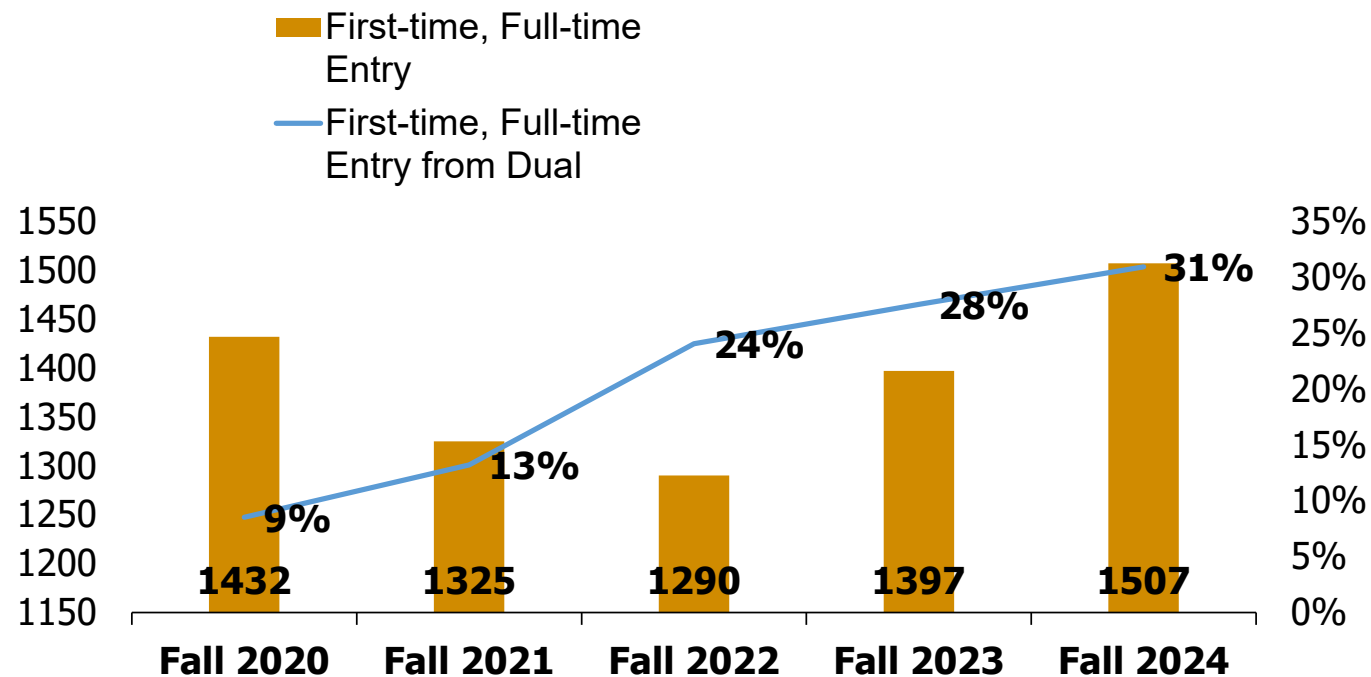


Key Highlights

- Dual credit enrollment has increased by nearly 400% since fall 2019
- Fall 2024: More than 3,500 enrolled



Dual Credit Student Conversion*

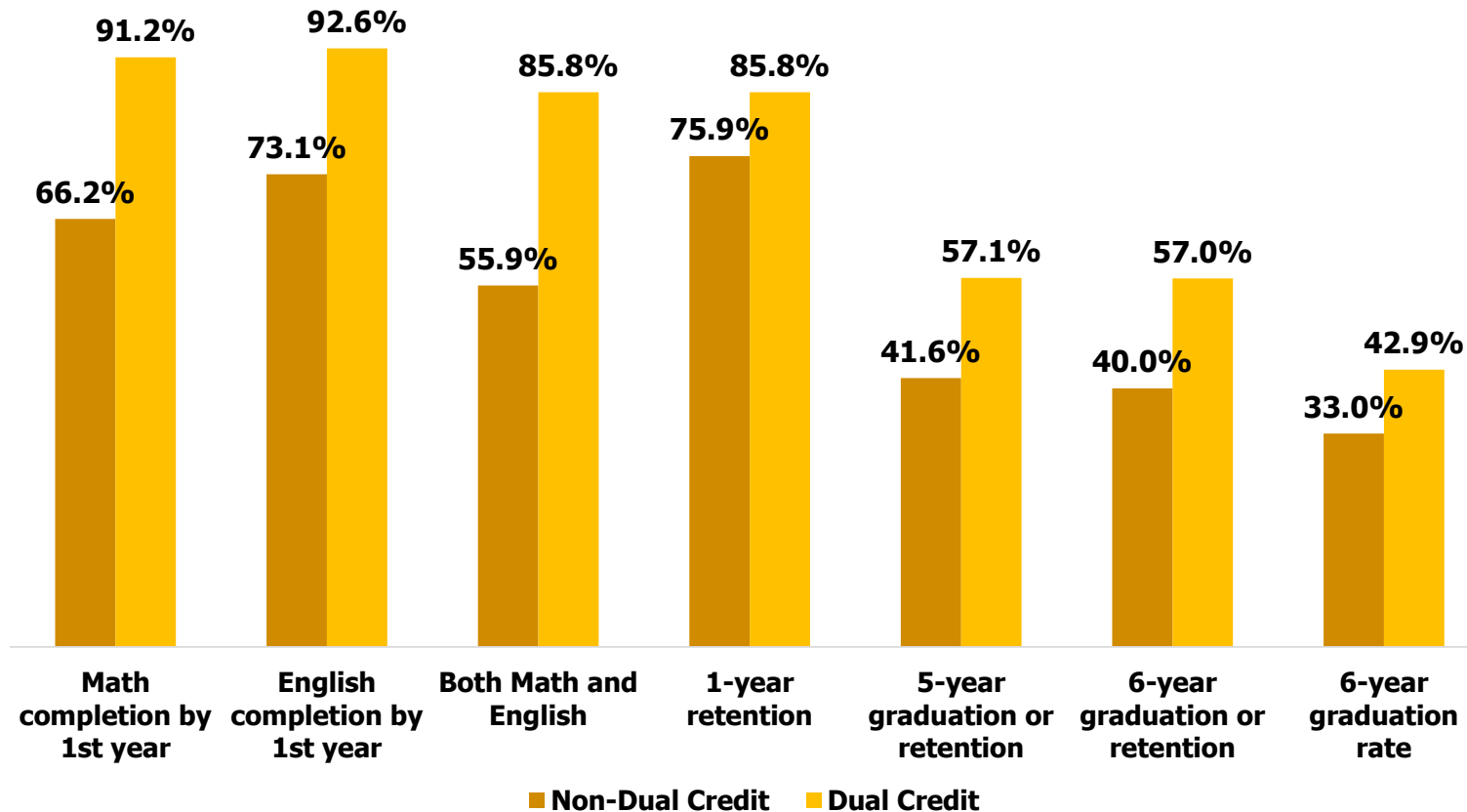


Key Highlights

- 282% increase in NSU dual credit students who matriculated to NSU from Fall 2020 to Fall 2024
- Nearly 1 of 3 students with first-time, full-time entry at NSU was formerly an NSU dual credit student



Dual Credit Effectiveness*



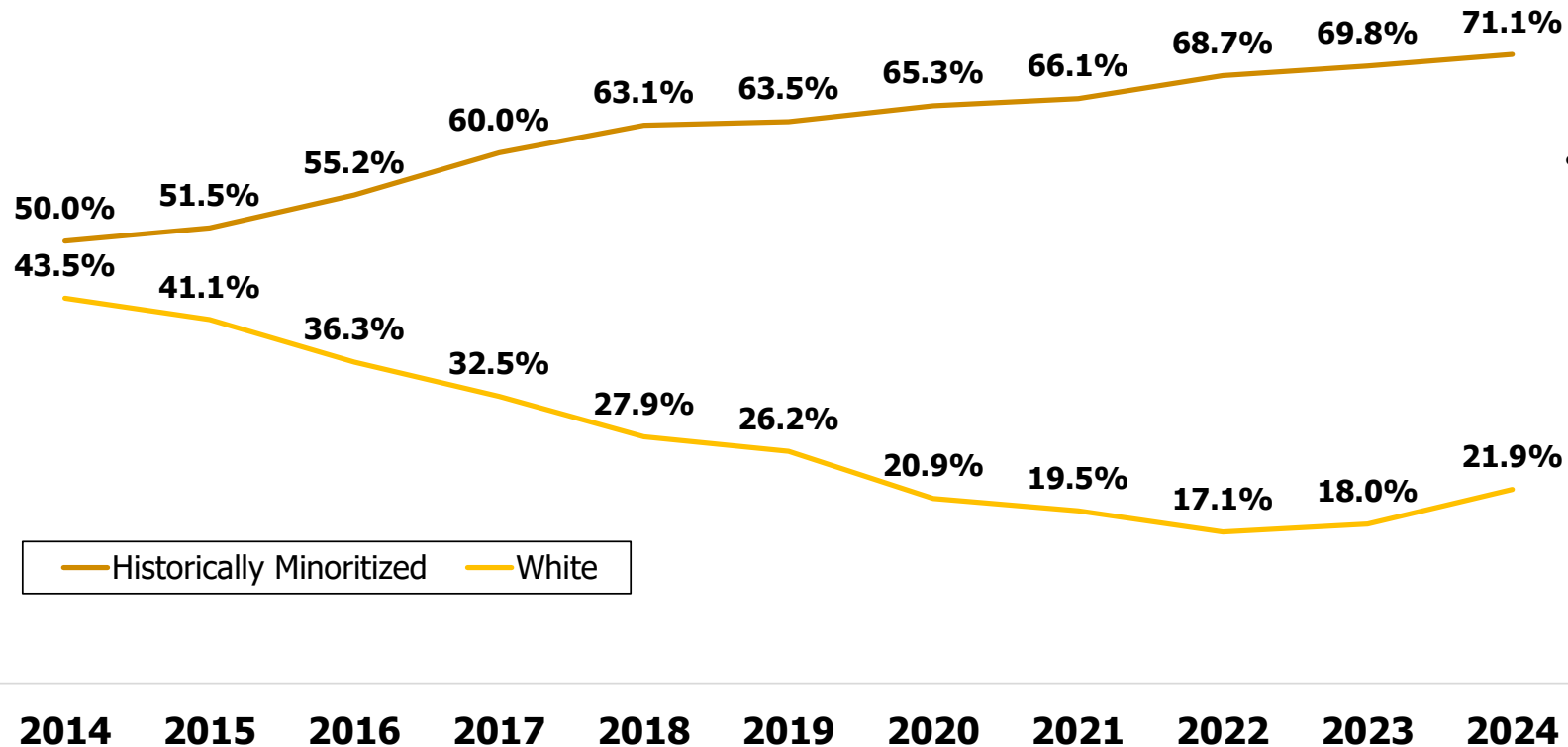
Key Highlights

- Fall 2023: Dual credit students perform better in 1st year Math and English
- Fall 2018: Dual credit students are more likely to graduate
- Even among students who enter their 1st year with a 3.0 GPA, dual credit students still perform better
- Sample size for 6-year graduation rate is small, but rate is nonetheless significantly higher

Fall Enrollment Distribution within Race/Ethnicity Categories

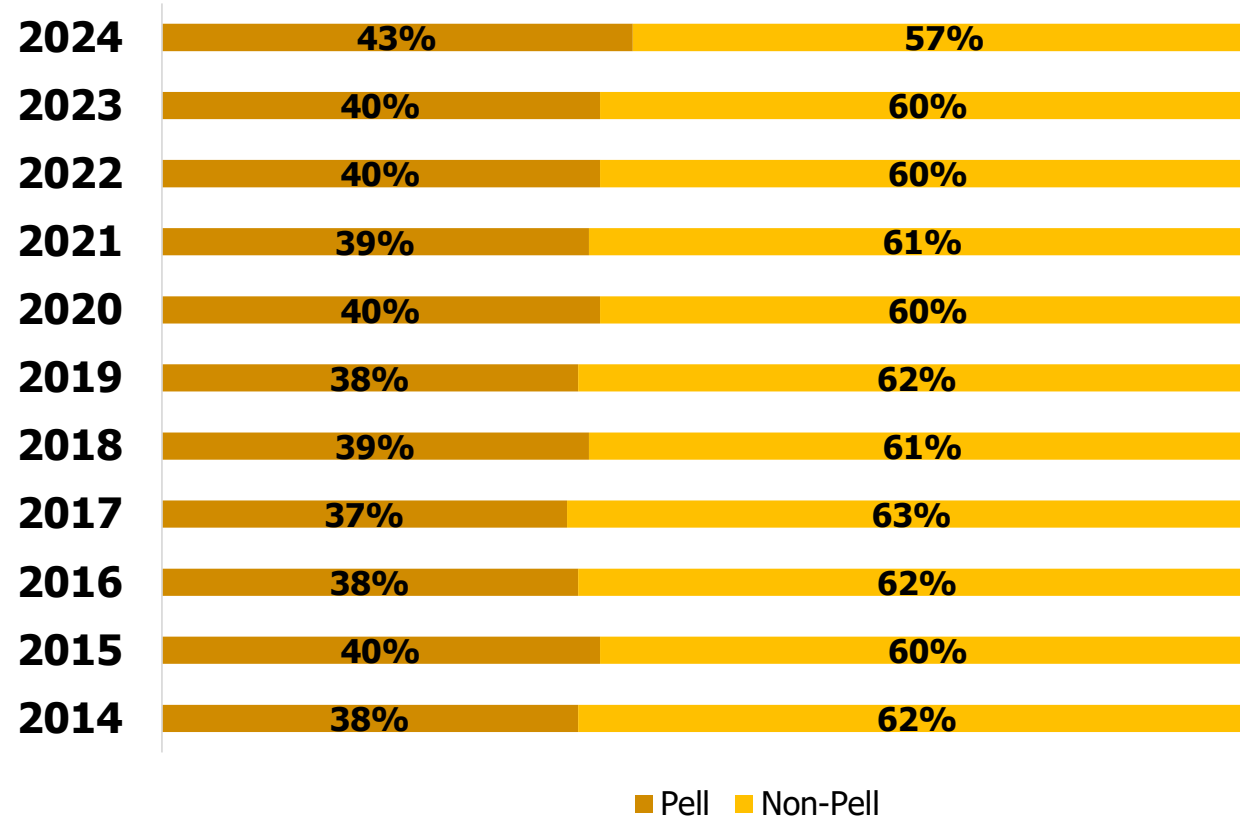


Key Highlights

- Demographic make-up of student body has become significantly more diverse and is nearly seven percent higher than the rate for all NSHE institutions



Annual Enrollment Distribution within Pell and Non-Pell Categories

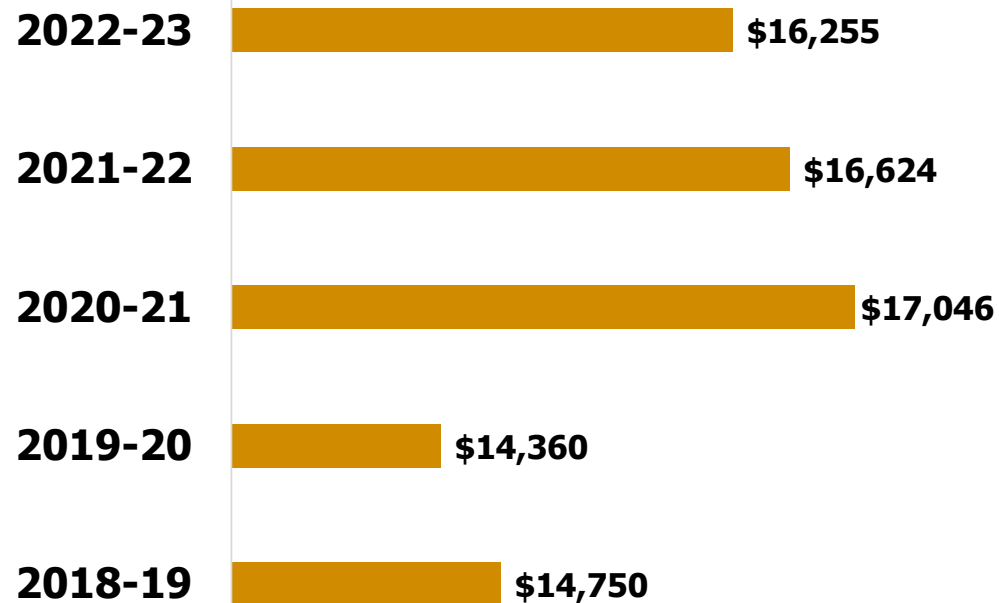


Key Highlights

- More than 40% of students receive Pell Grants—a figure that ticked up 3% from 2023 to 2024
- Pell Grant recipients oscillated between 38% and 40% between 2014 and 2023



Net Tuition

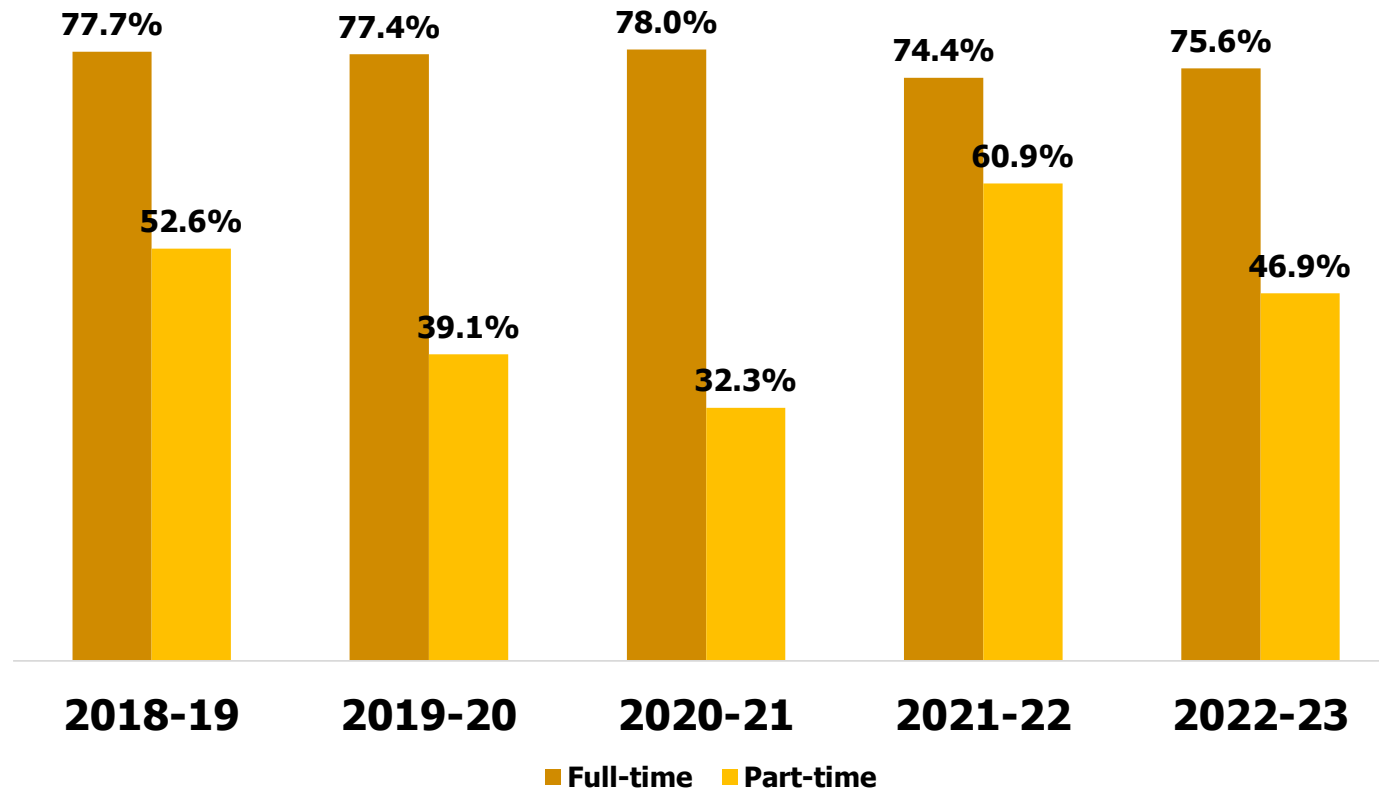


Key Highlights

- Despite national trends indicating rising college costs, NSU has successfully reduced net tuition for its students for three consecutive academic years
- This net reduction is attributable to supporting our students with more scholarships and grants—a 30% increase from Fall 2019 to Fall 2024



Fall to Fall Persistence Rates (FT/PT)

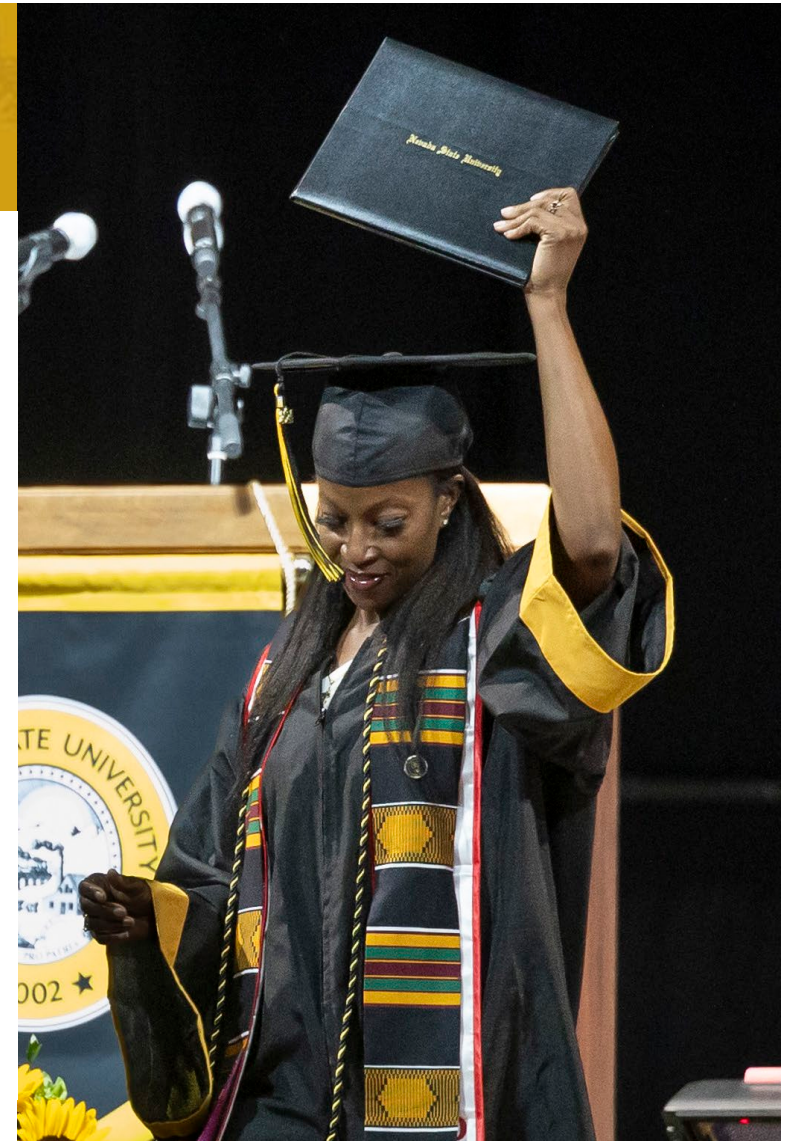
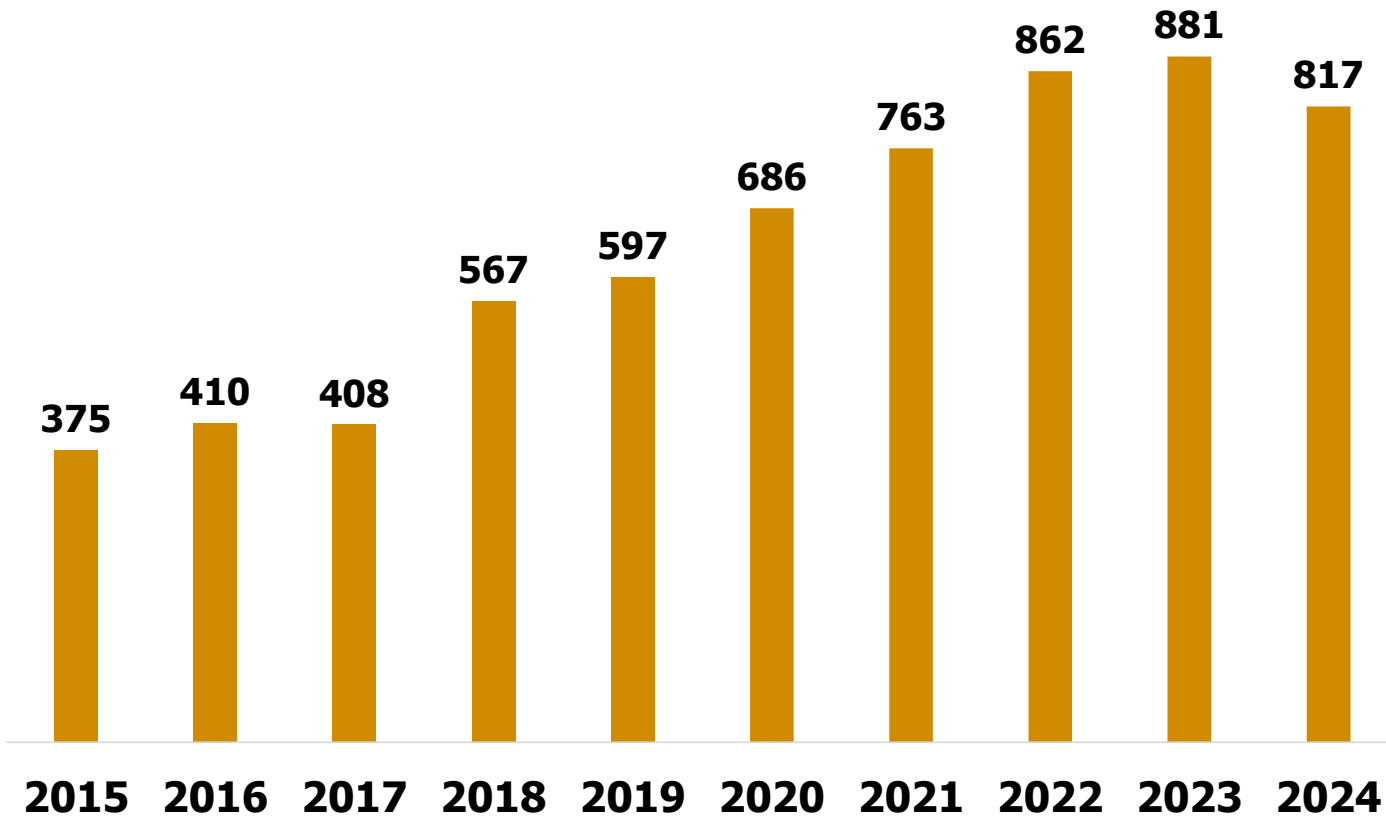


Key Highlights

 - While PT retention spiked during Year 2 of the pandemic, the upward trend continues

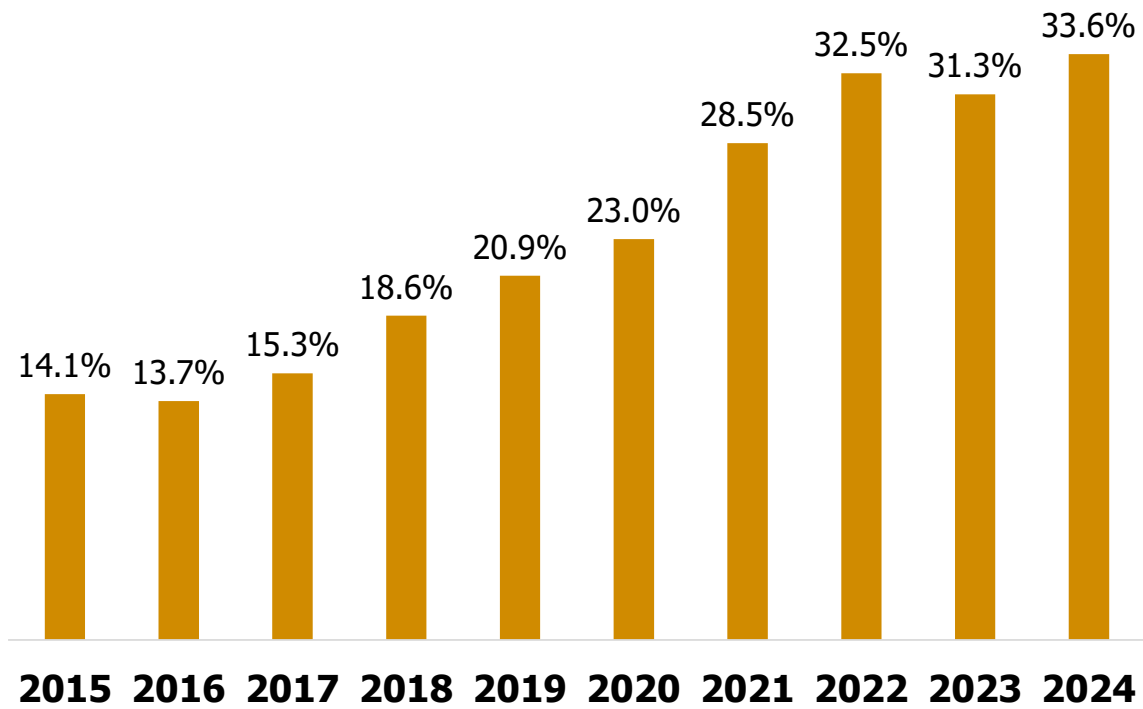

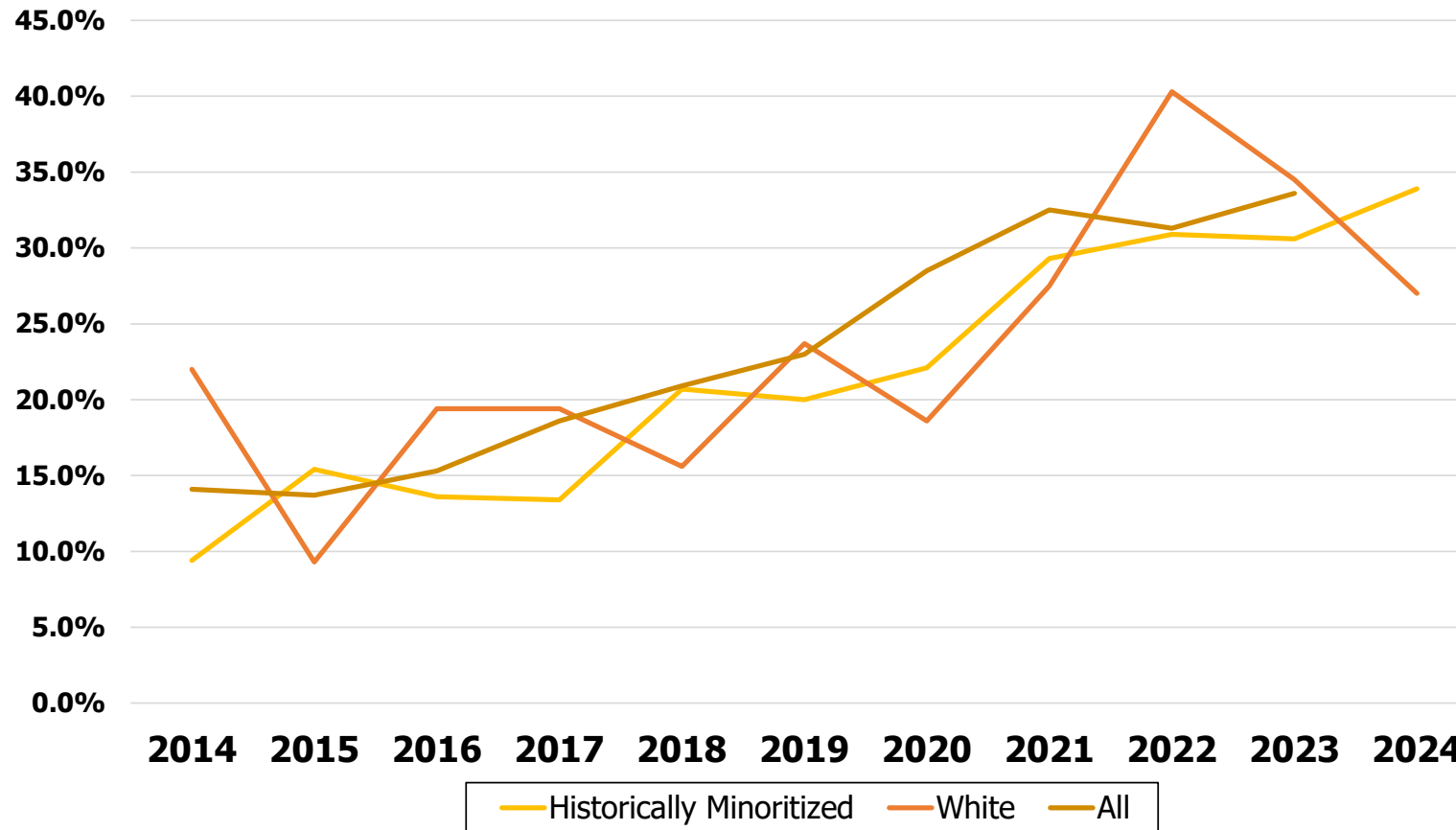

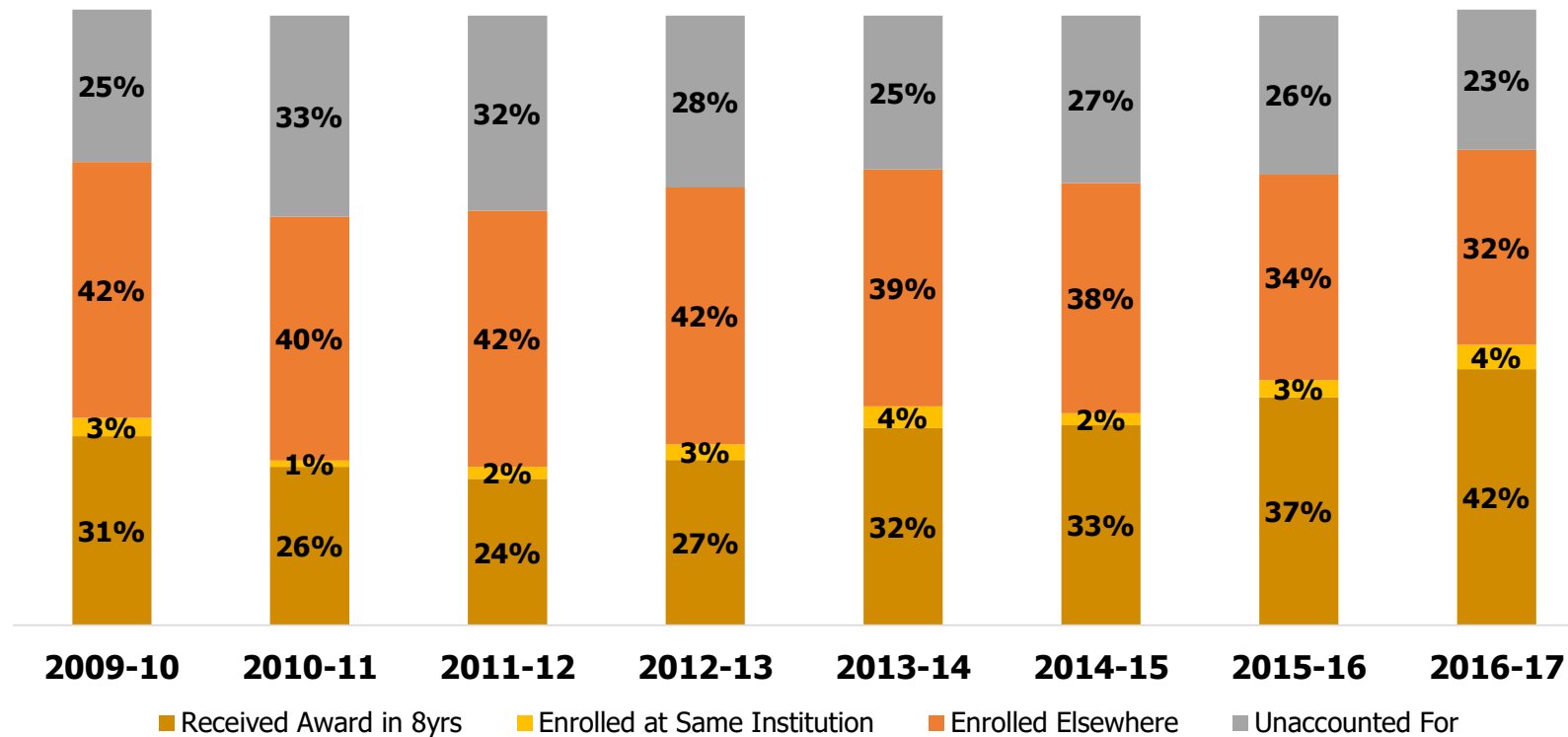
- Modern trend: Historically minoritized students are just as, if not more, likely to graduate within six years



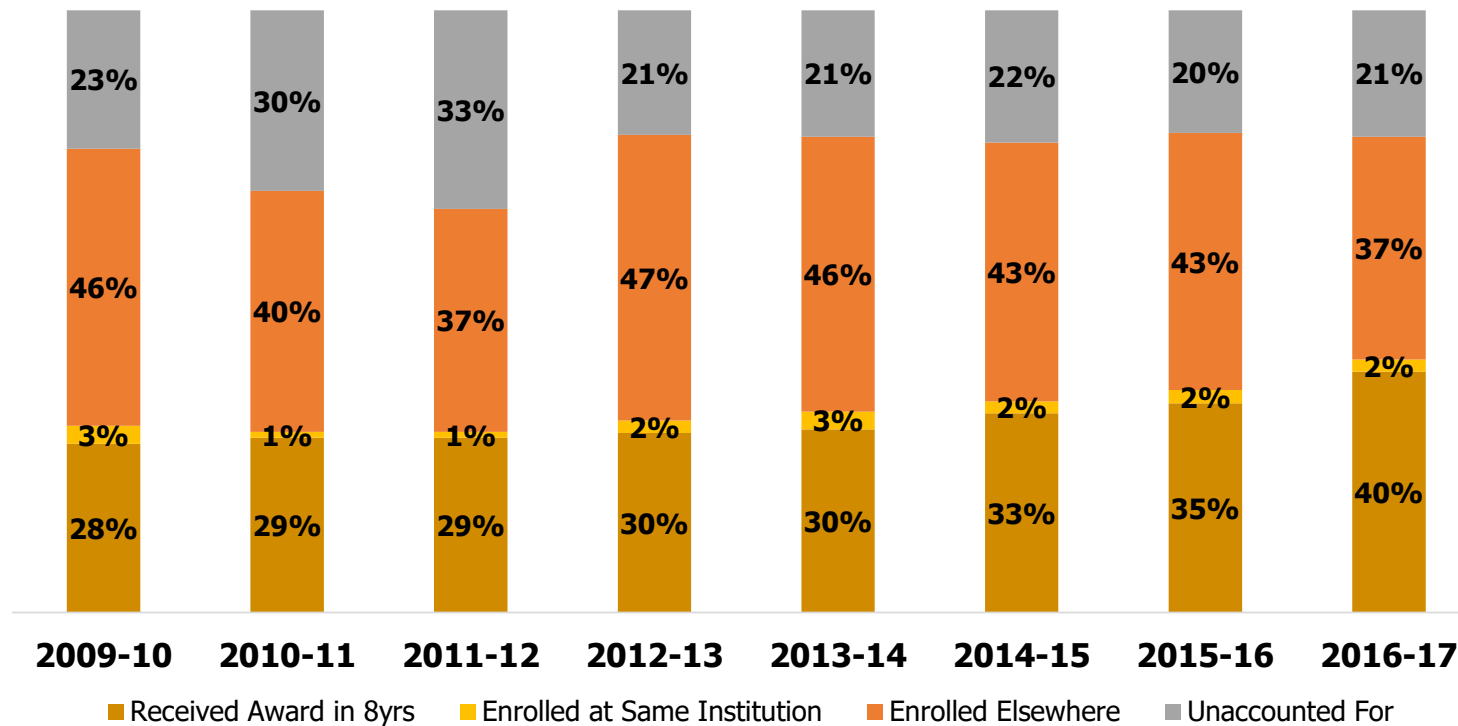
Pell Recipient Outcome Measures

Non-Pell Outcome Measures

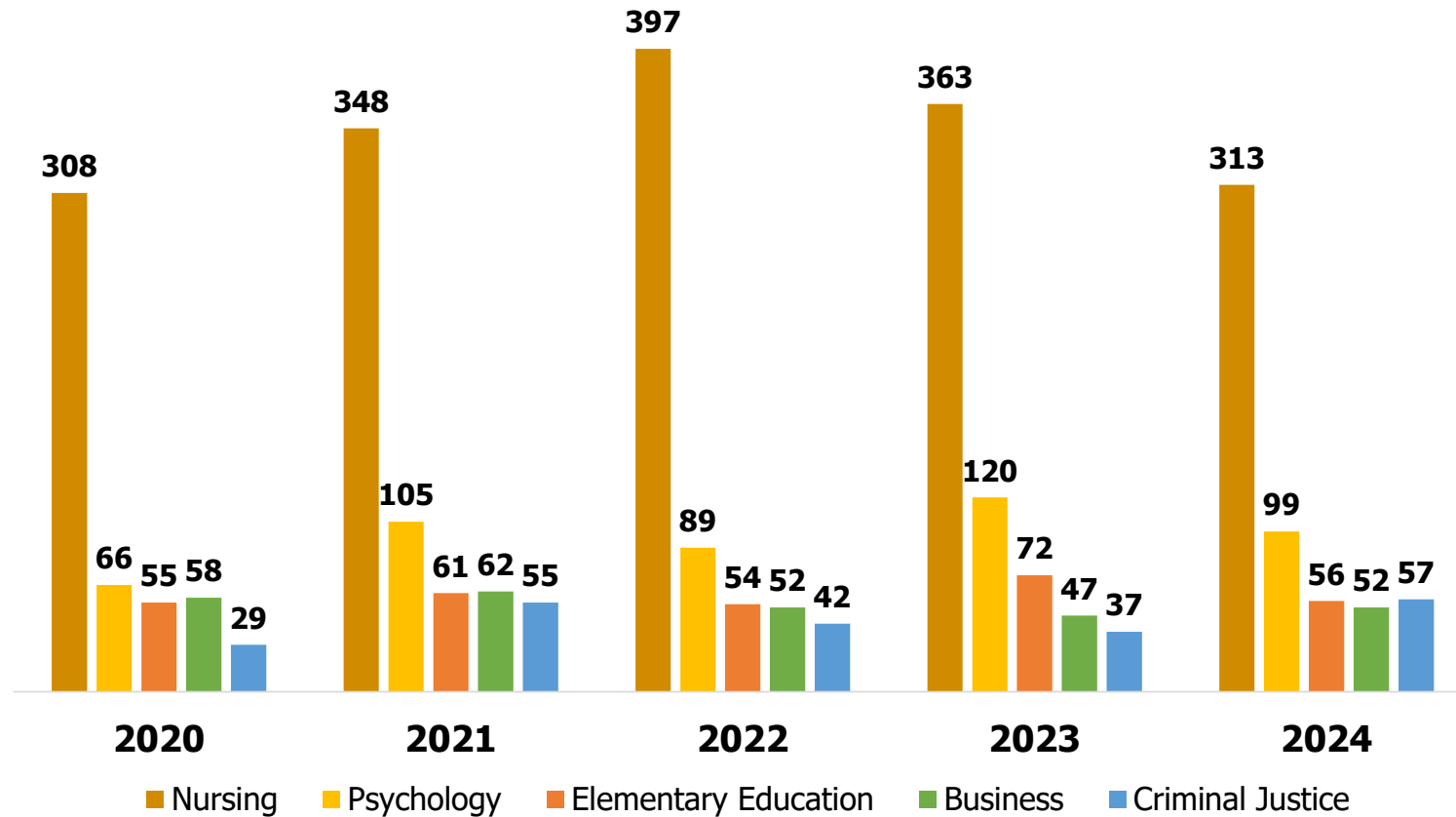


Key Highlights
