






NSHE Share of General Fund

Compared to 2009 Level


















State-Supported Revenue Per FTE







State Appropriations Per FTE














Revenue Per FTE






Institutional Funding Per FTE Targets



WICHE Top 10% – Four-Year Institutions










Revenue Per FTE

Tuition and Fees Per FTE





WICHE Average – Two-Year Institutions











Formula Funding Model








Formula Distribution Comparison

Historical Benchmark Model








