Regents,

I'm a mom of four: one college grad, two in college, one in high school. I'm here because I believe women's sports must stay fair and safe for our daughters.

Transgender females are Biological MALES, who keep significant advantages in strength, speed, and power. When they compete in girls' events, our daughters lose scholarships, roster spots, and medals. This isn't inclusion—it's exclusion of biological females from the category created for them.

Our girls also deserve privacy. No female athlete should have to change or shower alongside a biological male. Most adults wouldn't be comfortable doing that—why do we expect our daughters to be? Would YOU all be comfortable changing or showering together??

Federal policy is clear: the current Executive Order define sex as immutable biology, not gender identity. Ignoring this risks federal funding.

For background, I helped reopen youth sports in the 2021 shutdown, I serve on the Nevada State Soccer Association Disciplinary Committee and on my high school's Athletic Hall of Fame Committee, and I'm currently suing Clark County School District for violating my First

Amendment rights on opposing radical gender ideology.

Please protect women's sports and private spaces. Our daughters are counting on it. If we don't see change, parents like ME will keep speaking up and holding decision-makers accountable.
