3. BYLAW REVIEW, NAME AND DUTIES OF THE SECURITY COMMITTEE

FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

Chair Patrick J. Boylan will lead a discussion on the name and duties of the Security Committee, as set forth in [Title 1, Article VI, Section 3, Subsection \(h\)](#) of the *Bylaws of the Board of Regents* and outlined below.

The Security Committee shall:

- Study issues and policies to maintain a secure environment where students, faculty, staff and visitors may safely live, learn and work.
- Review policies, procedures and best practices concerning campus safety, homeland security and cybersecurity issues.
- Monitor campus safety issues and receive quarterly updates from all institutions on campus crime statistics.
- Ensure institutions develop and periodically update emergency response plans.
- Make policy recommendations to the Board intended to provide a safe and secure environment for students, faculty, staff and the public at all campuses and offices of the Nevada System of Higher Education.

The Committee may provide feedback on specific language and/or proposed amendments to the name and/or duties of the Security Committee, and may direct staff to bring proposed amendments back to the Committee in draft form for review and possible action at a future meeting.

4. QUARTERLY UPDATE, CAMPUS CRIME STATISTICS **INFORMATION ONLY**

Arnold Vasquez, Chief of Police, University Police Department-Southern Command, and Eric James, Chief of Police, University Police Department-Northern Command, will present a quarterly update on crimes that have occurred at NSHE campuses served by Southern Command and Northern Command, respectively, pursuant to Title 1, Article VI, Section 3, Subsection (h) of the *Bylaws of the Board of Regents*. 6. SAFETY AND SECURITY, NSHE SYSTEM ADMINISTRATION OFFICES **FOR POSSIBLE ACTION**

Chair Patrick J. Boylan will lead a discussion of the current safety and security conditions at the NSHE System Administration Offices in Las Vegas and Reno, including potential vulnerabilities, areas of concern, and opportunities for improvement. The Committee will consider the need for a comprehensive assessment of safety and security at System Administration Offices and may provide direction on the scope and approach for such an assessment, potential resources and expertise needed, and recommended next steps based on the assessment findings.

7. REPORTING STRUCTURE, UNIVERSITY POLICE DEPARTMENTS FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

Chair Patrick J. Boylan will lead a discussion on the reporting structure of University Police Departments, Northern and Southern Commands. The discussion may include a review of current policy set forth in [Title 4, Chapter 1, Section 12](#) of the *Board of Regents Handbook*, as well as findings and recommendations from the 2026 [Campus Police and Public Safety Functions Assessment](#) conducted by the International Association of Campus Law Enforcement Administrators. The Committee may provide direction to staff regarding potential changes to the current reporting structure. (Ref. [SEC-7](#))

8. PROCESS FOR RESPONDING TO THREATS AGAINST ELECTED OFFICIALS INFORMATION ONLY

Arnold Vasquez, Chief of Police, University Police Department–Southern Command, and Eric James, Chief of Police, University Police Department–Northern Command, will provide an overview of the process for responding to threats against elected officials while performing their official duties. The presentation and discussion may include, but will not be limited to, applicable policies and procedures, laws, Constitutional rights, and law enforcement best practices.
