# NEVADA STUDENT ALLIANCE NEVADA SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE NEVADA SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION 2023–2025 BIENNIAL BUDGET REQUEST; ITEMS FOR SPECIAL CONSIDERATION; NUMBERS: 1) RESTORATION OF BUDGET CUTS IN WEIGHTED STUDENT CREDIT HOURS; AND 6) ENROLLMENT RECOVERY FUNDING

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic and resulting economic fallout has caused significant hardships. The hardships of 2020 and 2021 would have been far worse without the extraordinary steps taken by governments, churches, communities, and everyday citizens to respond to the pandemic and its economic fallout. Immediately noticed by all who responded was the disparities of impact between communities.

WHEREAS, the impact of the pandemic and the economic fallout, have been widespread, but remain particularly prevalent among socioeconomically disadvantaged populations of this state. These disproportionate impacts reflect harsh, long-standing inequities, among class, race, and rural divides. These impacts are most demonstrated in the areas of education, employment, housing, and health care which the crisis has exacerbated. Households with children and especially those with women as head-of-household continue to face higher hardship rates.

WHEREAS, and in recognition of the diversity of our state population and the Nevada System of Higher Education institutions which serve them, we acknowledge that the budgetary effects of a global pandemic will be disproportionately felt and weighted in response to the number of families, nontraditional students, historically disadvantaged and rural populations concerned.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Nevada Student Alliance, on behalf of the +110,000 students of the Nevada System of Higher Education in recognizing the need for continued and nuanced response to the to the financial implications of the COVID-19 pandemic, does hereby support the Nevada System of Higher Education 2023–2025 Biennial Budget Request at Items for Special Consideration numbers: 1) Restoration of Budget Cuts in Weighted

Student Credit Hours; and the "hold-harmless" provisions in 6) Enrollment Recovery Funding, as areas of budgetary priority.

- **-Be it further resolved that**, this resolution does not negate or diminish any previous resolution of the Nevada Student Alliance concerning budgetary priorities of the 2023–2025 Biennium.
