Board of Regents met in regular form. All present also President Brown, Professor Ring and Foster Gould.

After lengthy discussion it was decided that all applicants for admission would have to stand an examination in arithmetic, grammar, penmanship and reading.

The age at which a student could enter the University was discussed. The law made it 15 years, and none under that age could be admitted.
