November 4, 1905

The Board of Regents met at 10 o'clock A.M., Saturday, November 4, 1905. Present Regents Booher, Smith and Starrett. Also Dean Wilson.

Minutes of September 30, 1905 read and approved.

The Secretary read the balance sheets showing the condition of all funds on September 30th. Also a Statement of Insurance on buildings and equipment and how apportioned with agents and their companies.

On motion of Regent Booher, seconded by Regent Starrett, that on and after the school year of 1906, every male student not disqualified be required to do and perform military duty and every male student disqualified by physical disability be required to do military duty in the Signal Corps.

Regent Starrett moved, seconded by Regent Booher, that the resignation of Lieutenant Cazier, Company B, be forwarded to the Governor with the request that the same be accepted and that Mr. Cazier be notified that upon acceptance of his resignation, he will be required to drill in the ranks or leave the University.

Upon motion of Regent Starrett, seconded by Regent Booher, the Chairman of the Board was authorized to do what he thought necessary to the Heating Plants in Manzanita and Lincoln Halls for the purpose of heating the buildings properly.

On motion of Regent Booher, seconded by Regent Starrett, Professor N. E. Wilson was elected Acting President of the University, in the absence of the President.

On motion of Regent Booher, seconded by Regent Starrett, Superintendent Brown was authorized to have board walks laid as follows: from Lincoln Hall and Manzanita Hall to the new Dining Hall and from Stewart Hall to Manzanita Hall.

Mr. Leigh R. Stanley appeared before the Board with a proposition

for an ad from the University in the proposed Christmas issue of the Carson News. The Secretary of the Board was instructed to advise Mr. Stanley that the condition of the funds would not permit the expenditure of any money for said purpose.

Upon motion, seconded and carried, the Secretary was instructed to notify the Chairman of the Library Committee that the employment of extra help in the Library at the noon hour be discontinued from this date as the condition of the funds would not permit any increased expenditures.

Upon motion of Regent Booher, seconded by Regent Starrett, the appointment of Professor F. G. Beylik as Assistant Chemist in the Experiment Station until January 1, 1906 at Sixty dollars per month was approved.

Upon motion of Regent Starrett, seconded by Regent Booher, the Acting President was authorized to have a billiard table placed in Lincoln Hall for the use of students only. The thanks of the Board was extended to Mr. W. H. Davis, one of the students, for the billiard table presented to the University for use of students in Lincoln Hall.
