	Together, Mr. Theron H. and Mrs. Naomi Goynes have spent a combined total of
	63 years as teachers and administrators in the Clark County School District. Mr.
	Goynes as a teacher, counselor, adult education coordinator, assistant principal
	and principal. Mrs. Goynes as a teacher, reading specialist, dean of students and
	junior high school assistant principal. In addition to Mr. Goynes services as an
	educator, he served as a North Las Vegas City councilman for 20 years. Twelve of
	those years were spent as mayor pro-temp. In September of 1981, Mr. Goynes
	became the first elected African American in Nevada history to head a government
	body when he chaired a council meeting in the absence of the mayor.

	After graduating from Prairie View A& M University in 1952, Mr. Goynes joined the
	United States Air Force and served his country for four years. Upon his honorable
	discharge, and after accepting a teaching appointment in Nashville, Arkansas, he
	met and fell in love with his wife, Naomi. The Goynes moved to Las Vegas in 1964
	and have been making a difference in their community of North Las Vegas ever
	since. Mr. and Mrs. Goynes have been honored with numerous awards for their
	contributions to the community, including garnering the distinction of having named
	after them the Theron H. Goynes Park (1998) and the Theron H. & Naomi D.
	Goynes Elementary School (2005).
