Richard N. Katz will present the report requested by the Chancellor on E-Learning. This report is the result of a project undertaken by Richard N. Katz & Associates and guided by the Chancellor's ad-hoc NSHE E-Learning Steering Committee to evaluate existing and alternative distance education strategies to promote the educational goals of the System. This report includes a review of national trends, current strategies and challenges across NSHE institutions, and recommendations for action. The Board may approve the report and may provide direction for next steps to address recommendations concerning the delivery of E-Learning.
