2. MIDTOWN PARK MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING, UNLV

FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

UNLV President Neal J. Smatresk requests Board of Regents' approval of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the proposed Midtown Park Project which will encompass the redevelopment of property immediately north of the main campus into new student housing for the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. (*Refs. BOR-2a, BOR-2b, BOR-2c and BOR-2d*)

FISCAL IMPACT: The MOU provides for a Purchase and Sale Agreement for the purchase by UNLV of real property generally described in the MOU. The purchase price is \$17 million. The purchase of the real property is contingent on 1) an appraisal valuing the property at no less than \$17 million and 2) UNLV's diligent and thorough inspection of the property. The Purchase and Sale Agreement for the real property is subject to Board of Regents approval.

Additionally, subject to the appraisal valuing the real property at no less than \$17 million, UNLV agrees to reimburse Educational Facilities

Development Services NVI, LLC, (EFDS) 50 percent of the documented predevelopment costs as detailed in the MOU, subject to UNLV's reasonable approval and not to exceed \$250,000, if the Board of Regents does not approve the Implementing Agreements, which include but are not limited to, the Purchase and Sale Agreement.
