

Bio for Dr. Kenneth Coll

Dr. Kenneth M. Coll is Dean for the College of Education at University of Nevada, Reno, appointed in 2013. Prior to this appointment, he was Associate Dean for the College of Education at Boise State University. Before going to Boise State University and serving as Chair of Counselor Education, he was a tenured faculty member at the University of Wyoming and Director of the Counselor Education Doctoral Program. Dr. Coll received his doctorate in Counseling from Oregon State University.

The author of roughly 60 peer reviewed journal articles and book chapters, Coll has held over \$4 million in grants and contracts to-date. His research has primarily been on school-based risk and resilience factors, effective assessment, and counseling interventions with high-risk adolescent populations. Coll has received a number of awards for his research. He is currently Principal Investigator for UNR's NevadaTeach grant, a nationally recognized math and science teacher education initiative, and has directed Boise State University's Institute for the Study of Addiction, and has worked closely with a number of American Indian children's school and mental health systems of care programs.

Coll is a member of the West Ed board, Dean's for Impact, and Past- President of the Idaho Association of Counselors and Supervisors. He also served on the Idaho Governor's Behavioral Health Transformation Task Force.
