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
Academic Focus

- INBRE Partnership- Focus on providing firstgeneration students access to STEM fields and education
- Impact of EPY 101 Course
 - Students who took EPY101 in addition to MATH95, or MATH96 had a higher rate of persistence to the next highest level course (MATH96, or MATH120/126 respectively) when compared to students who did not co-enroll in EPY101.
- Impact of Math Preparation


