
For over 20 years, the Nevada State College Foundation has been raising funds for the college. Started before the college began, a group of dedicated community members created the Foundation to ensure the college could accept tax deductible gifts to help students, faculty and staff. Now, in it's 22nd year, the Foundation has grown in size and diversity, but our mission stays the same.

The mission of the Nevada State College Foundation (Foundation) is to raise funds in support of the educational, technology, operational, facility, and research needs of the students, faculty, staff, and volunteers of the College and Foundation.

FY 22 Giving

In FY2022 the Foundation raised \$1,202,834, a 7% increase from the previous year. Friends and Alumni make up 77% of the dollars raised, and faculty and staff represent 67% of the gifts received. The focus on fundraising in this challenging time continued to be for student emergency aid and scholarships for students.

One of our challenges in FY22 was staffing. The Advancement Team worked most of the year at a 50% staffing level. One of our opportunities has been the expansion of the Foundation board. We have been strategic in board development by increasing diversity of gender, ethnicity, race, age and profession.



Giving Highlights

Nevada State Student Wellness

The Student Emergency Aid Fund was created to help students with unexpected medical expenses, emergency housing assistance, transportation, food, childcare, and other needs that if not met could result in a student not being able to continue their education. Our goal is to achieve health equity and positive transformation for all students. We provide safe spaces where students can address their challenges, embrace their personal growth, and develop resilience. Our holistic approach honors the whole person as we strive to bridge gaps in basic needs, provide free mental health counseling, and deliver year-round programming. Dependent on financial and in-kind contributions, the on-campus food pantry is utilized daily by students. Our work would not be possible without the support of Charles Schwab Bank, The Gene Haas Foundation, and individual faculty and staff donors.

Navarrete planned gift

School of Education faculty member Lori Navarrete has included a bequest in her estate that will create an endowed scholarship for students working towards a degree and career in Education. Her motivation for this planned gift came from her work with students in higher education. Her teaching and research interests and experiences have been focused in areas related to special education teacher preparation, educator cultural competence, addressing teacher pipeline issues, and supporting first generation college students.

Sustainability work

In FY22 the Sustainability Council initiated efforts to provide our southern Nevada community the motivation and tools to consider becoming part of the sustainability workforce and support environmental stewardship and sustainable living. With investment from Wells Fargo Bank, the Sustainability Exploration Center was created to highlight themes such as environmental justice, climate change science, green energy alternatives, careers in sustainability, and choices for improving energy and water conservation in our daily lives.

Sankofa Program Launch


It is well known that Nevada is experiencing an acute teacher shortage. A compounding issue is that our teacher workforce does not represent the diversity of our community. In response, Nevada State launched Sankofa Arising, with support from MGM Resorts Foundation, to advance African American students, address our statewide K-12 education teacher shortage, improve workforce development, and create social mobility. Sankofa is from the Twi language of Ghana representing "the learning from the past to move forward." This one-year teacher preparation pipeline program is designed to support and assist a cohort of Black students through the teacher pipeline from high school to college to licensure. It is designed to increase the recruitment and retention of diverse teachers and future teachers. The Sankofa Arising model employs service learning as an academic tool that is used to help develop support networks between our growing number of Teacher Academy High Schools, current Nevada State undergraduate education majors, and recent Nevada State College graduates of color who are currently teaching.


