6. NSHE EQUITY IN HIRING AND RETENTION, BLIND HIRING IMPLEMENTATION **FOR POSSIBLE ACTION**

A representative from UNLV will report of the status of the blind hiring pilot. The Committee will discuss the status and outcomes of the pilot and may direct the Chancellor to develop policy to formalize the program across the System in consultation with the Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Access Council (IDEA) and the Human Resources Advisory Committee (HRAC).

The Back on Track Program, primarily a dual enrollment pathways program, will serve credit-deficient students and offer opportunities for continuing education through a vigorous and holistic multi-tiered system of supports designed to reach and increase access for marginalized populations in dual enrollment pathways.
