- Chairman when the MOU was signed between UNLV and UNR regarding the expansion of Public Medical Education in Nevada, as well as in September 2014 when the MOU specifically added a new independent accredited medical school at UNLV.

- Chairman when the first budget for the UNLV School of Medicine was negotiated with Governor Brian Sandoval.

- Spearheaded the University Police Consolidation first in northern Nevada followed a couple years later in southern Nevada.
 - North: \$477,149 savings annually. Since 2016 when the Northern consolidation occurred, the savings have been upwards of \$3.8M.
 - South: October 2019 estimated cost savings of \$1,620,914. The Southern consolidation occurred in 2019.

- NRS 396.545 - Payment of fees and expenses of dependent child of public safety officer killed in the line of duty; Trust account for the Education of Dependent Children.
 - Back in 2010, the account balance was zero and had no money to pay the fees and expenses.
 - Raised \$10k from the private sector so that no one would be harmed, and then helped get permanent funding from the Nevada Legislature. Prior to the permanent funding, NSHE had go to IFC to get the funding approved.

- Served as one of three Regents on the Nevada Legislature Higher Education Funding Formula Subcommittee along with Regents Geddes and Wixom.

- Chairman when the Board approved the UNLV and Raiders Joint Use Agreement allowing the UNLV Football team to play in Allegiant Stadium.

- Former member of the UNLV Campus Improvement Authority Board of Directors.

- Spearheaded moving the NSHE System Administration-South Office from rented space to the currently owned building which is 100% paid for. NSHE has its own dedicated parking including the empty lot behind the rear parking area. The building cost was approximately \$3.5M.

- Responsible for moving away from laptops to the current iPad and BoardPaaS software that is still being used. Prior to each meeting, Board members were sent a Federal Express package that included a disk which had to be loaded onto a laptop and then brought to each meeting.
