2. FY 2025 COST-OF-LIVING ADJUSTMENT FOR CLINICAL FACULTY, UNR AND UNLV SCHOOLS OF MEDICINE

University of Nevada, Reno President Brian Sandoval and University of Nevada, Las Vegas President Keith E. Whitfield will request approval of the application of the FY 2025 cost-of-living adjustment as applied to their respective School of Medicine clinical faculty base salaries in the amount of four percent (4%), effective October 1, 2024. <u>(*Ref. BOR-2*)</u>

FISCAL IMPACT: The University of Nevada, Reno School of Medicine and University of Nevada, Las Vegas Kirk Kerkorian School of Medicine will fund the four percent (4%) cost-of-living adjustment to the base salaries of their respective clinical faculty.

3. <u>CODE</u> REVISION, JOINT FACULTY <u>FOR POSSIBLE ACTION</u> APPOINTMENTS FOR SCHOOLS OF MEDICINE

University of Nevada, Reno President Brian Sandoval will request approval of a revision to the NSHE <u>Code</u> (*Title 2, Chapter 5, Section 5.4.11*) authorizing UNR Med to develop a unified academic title series and faculty tracks for non-tenure track clinician faculty it employs and the joint faculty employed by an affiliated hospital, subject to agreement by the affiliated hospital, approval by the University President, and reporting to the Chancellor. The proposed revision was presented for information at the September 8, 2023, Board of Regents meeting. (*Ref. BOR-3*)

4. HANDBOOK REVISION, PAID FAMILY LEAVE FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

Deputy General Counsel Carrie Parker and Director of Human Resources Sherry Olson will present for approval a revision to Board policy *(Title 4, Chapter 3, Section 19)* to provide paid family leave for eligible professional staff under certain circumstances in alignment with AB 376 passed in the 82nd (2023) Session of the Nevada Legislature. *(Ref. BOR-4)*

FISCAL IMPACT: Because paid family leave is paid at 50% salary and the professional staff member must hold 40 hours sick leave in reserve to take paid family leave, there is a fiscal impact of allowing professional staff to take paid family leave while holding onto sick leave. However, it is not possible to estimate the number of NSHE employees that will utilize such paid family leave.

5. *PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES MANUAL* REVISION, 2023-2025 TUITION AND FEES, WILLIAM S. BOYD SCHOOL OF LAW, UNLV

University of Nevada, Las Vegas President Keith E. Whitfield will request approval of a revision to the *Procedures and Guidelines Manual (Chapter 7, Section 20)* concerning the distribution of fees and tuition for the 2023-2025 biennium for the UNLV William S. Boyd School of Law. The proposed change will increase the registration fee distribution amount in the Financial Aid Fee and decrease the amount in Activities and Programs. <u>(*Ref. BOR-5*)</u>

ESTIMATED TIME: 10 mins.

6. PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES MANUAL REVISION, 2023-2025 TUITION AND FEES, SCHOOL OF DENTAL MEDICINE, UNLV

University of Nevada, Las Vegas President Keith E. Whitfield will request approval of a revision to the *Procedures and Guidelines Manual (Chapter 7, Section 21)* concerning the distribution of fees and tuition for the 2023-2025 biennium for the UNLV School of Dental Medicine. The proposed change will increase Student Access Funds to the minimum fifteen percent (15%) as required by Board policy (*Title 4, Chapter 18, Section 8 (B)*). (*Ref. BOR-6*)

FISCAL IMPACT: There will be a decrease of the state operating budget by approximately \$1.3m. UNLV Dental Medicine will cover this gap with self-supporting dollars to ensure students have the proper amount of program financial aid.

7. CHANCELLOR SEARCH, NSHE

At the August 29, 2023, special meeting of the Board of Regents, the Board took an action to commence a new search for a permanent Chancellor, following a review of relevant Board policies. An ad hoc Committee to Review the Policies Governing a Search for Chancellor was appointed and has begun its work. Accordingly, and in furtherance of the process, the Board shall make a determination whether to conduct a national, regional, in-state, or other search for a permanent Chancellor and whether the search committee shall be aided by a search consultant <u>(Title 2, Chapter 1, Section 1.5.4(f) and (h)</u>).

FISCAL IMPACT: The cost of engaging a search consultant is unknown at this time, but is likely to increase the fiscal cost to NSHE in excess of \$25,000.
