Joe Brown has lived in Nevada since 1968. Circa 1970, he developed the Keystone Corporation to preserve free-market principles and economic prosperity for the state of Nevada. Bob Maxey, the first general manager for the MGM hotel, was the chairman and Joe served as the president of the organization. The Keystone Corporation still exists today and is a well-known organization in support of private sector job creation, low taxation, and responsible government.

Joe Brown is a former appointee of President Ronald Reagan to the State Justice Institute and The Foreign Claims Settlement Commission of the United States. Joe has served as chairman or director of many business, civic, and charitable organizations, including the Nature Conservancy, the Department of Wildlife, the Nevada Development Authority, the Nevada Athletic Commission, Nellis (AFB) Support Team, the Catholic Community Services Board, Bank of America, Wells Fargo, and the founder of the Nevada Military Support Alliance.

Joe Brown is the only one in Nevada history who has been appointed to all three of the following commissions: Fish and Game (Wildlife Commission); Athletic Commission; and Gaming Commission. He served on the Gaming Commission from 2009-2015; Governor Gibbons appointed him and Governor Sandoval reappointed him.
