## Definition of Power-Based Violence

Any form of interpersonal violence intended to pressure, control, intimidate, or harm another person through the assertion of power over the person.

Includes, without limitation:

- Dating violence;
- Domestic violence, family violence;
- Gender-based violence;
- Violence based on sexual orientation, gender identity or expression;
- Sexual Assault;
- Sexual Harassment;
- Sexual Exploitation;
- Stalking;
- Observation of another person who is naked or engaging in sexual activity without his or her consent, including, without limitation, voyeurism.
