  - TPO - Temporary Protection Order

- Accompaniment reporting to law enforcement or detective interview

The Campus Victim Advocate (CVA) program provides FREE support and services to survivors of **power-based violence** to help you process in a **confidential** setting and connect you with community resources.

**What is power-based violence (PBV)?**  
*PBV is any form of violence that uses assertion of power, control, and/or intimidation with the intent to harm another emotionally, psychologically, or physically. It includes:*

- Sexual assault
- Domestic violence
- Intimate partner violence
- Harassment (any form)
- Human trafficking
- Stalking
- Intimidation
- Bullying


If you or someone you know is a survivor of PBV, please contact the CVA below.

**How the CVA Can Help:**

- Immediate crisis intervention
- Personal advocacy and emotional support for recent or past events
- On/off-campus resources and referrals
- Private and confidential consultation
- Safety planning
- Accompaniment to a forensic exam, police report, or court hearing
- Assistance in filing Victim Compensation and Protection Order applications
- Connection to a support group



**The meaning behind the butterfly**

As with any butterfly, they begin as a caterpillar.

The butterfly is proof that you can go through a great deal of darkness, yet still become something so beautiful.

The butterfly is a symbol of transformation, freedom, and rebirth.

Forever changed...  
With a beautiful new beginning.

Then, they transform into a chrysalis, surrounded by darkness.

Just when the caterpillar thought their life was over...

they began to fly.

**F.R.I.E.S. is an acronym we use to explain consent!**

Consenting is a **choice you make** without pressure, manipulation, or under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

**Freely Given**

**Reversible**  
You can **change their mind** about what they feel like doing, **anytime**. Even if you've done it before, and even if you're both naked in bed.

**Informed**  
You can only consent to something if you have the **full story** and all the information. If someone says they'll use a condom and then they don't, consent is violated.

**Enthusiastic**  
When it comes to consent, you should only do stuff you want to do, not things that you feel you're expected to do.

**Specific**  
Saying yes to one thing (like going on a date) **does not** mean you've said yes to other things (like having sex).

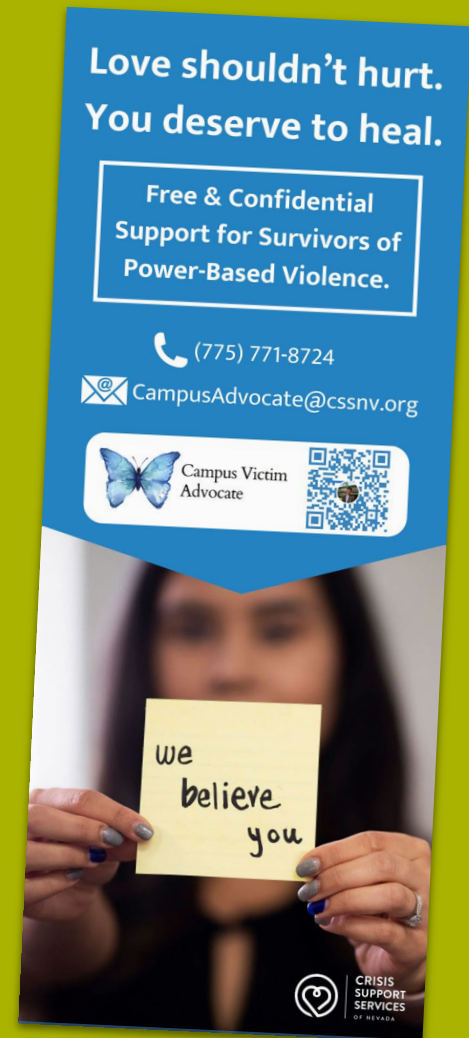
## Back
