3. Purpose: This matrix is intended for policy comparison, gap analysis, and system-level planning across NSHE.
4. Notes for interpretation.
  - 4.1. Universities (UNLV, UNR, NSU) generally offer more on-campus counseling, advocacy, and case management.
  - 4.2. Community colleges (CSN, TMCC, WNC) connect with Campus Victim Advocates and community partnerships.
  - 4.3. GBC reflects a rural, distributed service model, emphasizing referrals and policy-driven support.
  - 4.4. All institutions maintain Title IX compliance, reporting mechanisms, and prevention training, but depth of services varies by campus size and location.
