## Declaration of Intent of Residency

I hereby declare that I have abandoned any domicile or residence in any state or commonwealth of the United States of America other than the State of Nevada and I further certify that I have established a bona fide domicile or residence in the State of Nevada with the intent of making Nevada my true, fixed and permanent home and place of habitation, having clearly abandoned my former domicile or residence and having no intent to make any other location outside the State of Nevada my home and habitation.

I further certify that I have been domiciled or a resident in the State of Nevada for at least twelve (12) months immediately prior to the date of my application for reclassification to resident student status and that, therefore, I have been physically present and residing in Nevada for that entire period of time, excluding temporary, short-term absences for business or pleasure.

If the student is not granted in-state status, then he/she will revert to the regular out-of-state tuition for the second year, and, in addition, they must repay the difference between the full non-resident tuition and the "average" tuition paid during the first year. C. All entering law students must, within one of month of acceptance for admission, deposit $\$ 250$ to hold the applicant's place in the class. The deposit will be applied toward tuition and is fully refundable if the law school is notified by June 1 that the admitted student does not intend to attend the William S. Boyd School of Law. After June 1 the deposit will not be refunded.

Section 8. Tuition and Fees, UNLV School of Dental Medicine
A. All full-time School of Dental Medicine resident and non-resident students shall be assessed annual tuition and registration fees as follows:

B. Out-of-state tuition for students who establish residency during their first year will be assessed non-resident tuition and registration fees for the first year of the four-year program of study. Once granted in state status, they will pay resident registration fees for the next three years.
C. WICHE students must have evidence that they have applied for WICHE support from their state. Each out-of-state student must agree to apply for in-state status at the end of the first year of school. If the student is not granted in state status, then he/she will revert to the regular out-of-state tuition for the second year and beyond. Out of state WICHE students shall not be permitted to convert to in-state resident status.

D. All entering School of Dental Medicine resident and non-resident students must, according to the date specified in the acceptance letter for admission, make a $\$ 500$ non-refundable deposit to hold the applicant's place in the class. A second $\$ 500$ non-refundable deposit will be due June 1 for all entering School of Dental Medicine resident and non-resident students who were accepted prior to June 1 and paid the initial $\$ 500$ deposit. This second nonrefundable deposit is required to continue to hold the applicant's place in the class. Both of these deposits will be applied towards registration fees and/or tuition.

All entering School of Dental Medicine resident and non-resident students accepted after June 1 must, according to the date specified in the acceptance letter for admission, make a $\$ 1,000$ non-refundable deposit to hold the applicant's place in the class. This deposit is
required to hold the applicant's place in the class and will be applied toward registration fees and/or tuition.

## INTERNATIONAL STUDENT FEE

1. Position Statement

The recruitment, admission and advising of international students represents a tremendous cost to the University of Nevada, Reno and University of Nevada, Las Vegas. The logistical and administrative burdens of international students on the university are complex and expensive. Increased costs of international mailing, phone, facsimile, recruitment, specialized printing, translations and highly trained personnel forces the university to make difficult budgetary choices. These choices often leave international students short of receiving the proper levels of attention. (B/R 3/04)

Because of the limited resources of the Admissions and International Student Office, the need for funding aimed directly at the international students is essential. These funds will be directly used to support programs pertaining to international students. Additionally, it is not proper to use funds dedicated to benefit university students as a whole, to support activities that benefit only international students.
2. Resolve.

International students will pay a $\$ 100.00$ per student, per semester, International Student Fee. The revenue from this fee will be used to sustain enrollment functions in the Admissions, Graduate, and International Student offices, supporting only international students.

## Section 19. Special Course Fees

It is the policy of the Board of Regents that the registration fee be the only fee assessed for taking a course except as outlined in this section. The reasons for these exceptions are extraordinary instruction costs due to: (a) individual instruction (e.g., private music lessons), (b) class supplies (e.g., welding), (c) third party charges for use of a facility (e.g., golf), (d) special transportation requirements, or (e) some combination of these reasons. # UNIVERSITY AND COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM OF NEVADA PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES MANUAL 

## CHAPTER 18

Section 19. Nevada State Nursing Loan Program (formerly Chancellor's Memorandum \#02-01)

The nursing loan funds are available to eligible nursing students in amounts up to \$2,000 per semester for university students and up to $\$ 1,700$ per semester for state college and community college students.

The loan process is governed by a formal contract between the student and UCCSN. The nursing loans funds may be used for the fees, books, and living expenses incurred by the eligible students. The eligibility criteria, loan application procedures, and repayment requirements are outlined in the Board of Regent's Handbook (Title 4, Chapter 18, Section 19), which is appended to this memorandum.

As proscribed by Assembly Bill 378, loan funds not disbursed to nursing students by the close of fiscal year 2002 may be balanced forward for disbursement as student loans during fiscal year 2003. In addition, allocated loan funds not disbursed will be made available to other institutions of the System having unmet student needs consistent with the policy of the Nursing Loan Program. All loan funds not disbursed to students by June 30, 2003, will revert to the Trust Fund for Public Health. Loan repayments of principal and interest, net of collection costs, must ultimately be deposited to the State Treasury in Budget Account 1091, the State account established for the Trust Fund for Public Health.

Assembly Bill 378 did not establish a mechanism to account for the un-disbursed loan funds, nor establish a timeline to deposit the loan repayments to the Trust Fund for Public Health. Therefore, each UCCSN institution shall be required to provide an accounting to the System Administration Office of the loan disbursements and repayments on an annual basis as part of the year-end reconciliation process for State Appropriations and Authorizations. To mechanically account for the loan disbursements and repayments, a two-step, year-end process is necessary.

## ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES

1. Each institution will prepare a Reconciliation Worksheet at the close of the fiscal year to be submitted to the System Administration Office that separately identifies the amount of
nursing loans disbursed to students, the remaining balance of funds available to be loaned to nursing students, and the loan payments collected from the nursing students during the course of the fiscal year.
2. Based upon the information recorded on the Reconciliation Worksheets completed by each campus at the close of the fiscal year, the System Administration Office will prepare the State Work Programs required for (a) balancing forward to fiscal year 2003 the loan funds that were not disbursed to students during fiscal year 2002, (b) reverting to the Trust Fund for Public Health the nursing loan funds remaining after June 30, 2003, and (c) depositing the loan repayments to the Trust Fund for Public Health.

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

APPLICABLE LAW - The terms of this Nevada Nursing Loan Promissory Note (hereinafter called the Note) and any disbursements made under this Note shall be interpreted in accordance with Board of Regents Handbook, Title IV, Chapter 18, Section 18 and Nevada law. All sums advanced under this Note are subject to the Board of Regents regulations.

REPAYMENT - I am obligated to repay the principal and the interest that accrues on my loan(s) to the above-named institution (hereinafter called the School) over a period beginning 12 months after the date I cease to be at least a half-time student at an institution of higher education and ending 10 years later, unless I request in writing that my repayment period begin sooner. I understand that the School will report the amount of my installment payments, along with the amount of this loan to at least one national credit bureau. Interest on this loan shall accrue from the beginning of the repayment period. My repayment period may be shorter than 10 years if I am required by my School to make minimum monthly payments. My repayment period may be extended during periods of deferment or hardship, if approved by the School, and I may make graduated installments in accordance with a schedule approved by the School. I will make my installment payments in equal monthly installments as determined by the School. The School may round my installment payment to the next highest multiple of $\$ 5$. I will make a minimum monthly payment of $\$ 50$ in accordance with the Minimum Monthly Payment Section of the Terms and Conditions contained on the reverse side of this document.

LATE CHARGES - The School will impose late charges if I do not make a scheduled payment when due or if I fail to submit to the School on or before the due date of the payment, a properly documented request for any of the deferment or cancellation benefits as described below. The School has the sole discretion to determine whether to grant my request for any of the deferment or cancellation of loan as described below. Late charges will be in the amount of 8 percent of the installment or $\$ 4$, whichever is greater, but not more than $\$ 15$. The School may add the late charges to principal the day after the scheduled payment was due or include it with the next scheduled payment after I have received notice of the charge, and such notice is sent before the next installment is due.

CANCELLATION/DEFERMENT - I may apply for a cancellation or deferment of my loan. If I meet the eligibility requirements for a cancellation of my loan, the institution may cancel up to 100 percent of the outstanding principal loan amount. Information on eligibility and application requirements for deferments and cancellations is provided on page 2 of this Note. I am responsible for submitting the appropriate requests on time, and I may lose my benefits if I fail to file my request on time.

DEFAULT - The School may require me to repay the balance and any unpaid interest on this loan if: (1) I fail to make a payment within 90 days of the scheduled due date; (2) I fail to notify the School within 30 days of : (a) a change of my name or address or place of practice; or (b) the termination of the education for which I received this loan; or (3) I fail to comply with the terms and conditions of this promissory Note or written repayment agreement. I understand that if I default, the School will withhold any check made payable to me from the University of Nevada System and will apply said check to repayment of this student loan.

CHANGE OF STATUS - I will inform the School of any change in my name, address, telephone number, Social Security Number, or driver's license number.

PROMISE TO PAY: I promise to pay the School, or a subsequent holder of the Promissory Note, the sum of all amount(s) advanced to me under the terms of this Note, plus interest and other fees, which may become due as provided in this Note. I promise to pay all reasonable collection costs, including attorney fees and other charges, necessary for the collection of any amount not paid when due. I will not sign this Note before reading it, including the provisions on page 2 of this Note. This loan has been made to me without security or endorsement. My signature certifies I have read, understand, and agree to the terms and conditions of this Promissory Note.

## I UNDERSTAND THAT I AM RECEIVING A LOAN THAT MUST BE REPAID.

GENERAL TERMS: I agree that this Promissory Note shall be interpreted and enforced in accordance with the laws of the state of Nevada. I hereby consent to and agree that jurisdiction related to any action brought in connection with this agreement shall be in the courts of the state of Nevada. This is the complete and total agreement between me and School, and there are no other promises, representations or agreements other than those set forth in this Promissory Note. Any amendments hereto must be in writing signed by me and by the School.

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS (cont.)

GRACE PERIODS - I will receive an initial twelve-month grace period before the first payment of my Nevada Nursing Loan must be made. Interest does not accrue during the initial grace period. The twelvemonth initial grace period for Nevada Nursing Loans does not include any period up to 3 years during which I am called or ordered to active duty for more than 30 days from a reserve component of the Armed Forces of the United States, including the period necessary for me to resume enrollment at the next available enrollment period. I must notify the School that made my loan of the beginning and ending dates of my service, and the date I resume enrollment. If I am in my initial grace period when called or ordered to active duty, I am entitled to a new twelve-month initial grace period upon completion of the excluded period.

PREPAYMENT - I may prepay all or any part of my unpaid loan balance, plus any accrued interest, at any time without penalty. Amounts I repay in the academic year in which the loan was made and before the initial grace period has ended will be used to reduce the amount of the loan and will not be considered a prepayment. If I repay amounts during the academic year in which the loan was made and the initial grace period has ended, only those amounts in excess of the amount due for any repayment period shall be considered a prepayment. If, in an academic year other than the award year in which the loan was made, I repay more than the amount due for an installment, the excess will be used to repay principal unless I designate it as an advance payment of the next regular installment.

MINIMUM MONTHLY PAYMENT - If required by the School, I will make a minimum monthly payment amount of $\$ 50$. If the total monthly payment amount on this loan and any outstanding Nevada Nursing Loans I may have is less than the minimum monthly payment amount established by the School, the School may still require a minimum monthly payment amount. A minimum monthly payment amount will combine my obligation on this and all my outstanding Nevada Nursing Loans unless I have received loans with different grace periods and deferments. At my request and if I am eligible, the school may combine this minimum monthly payment amount with all my outstanding Nevada Nursing Loans. Under these circumstances the portion of the minimum monthly payment that will be applied to this loan will be the difference between the minimum monthly payment amount and the total amounts owed on a monthly basis on my other Nevada Nursing Loans.

DEFERMENTS - To apply for a deferment, I must request the deferment from the School. My request does not have to be in writing, but the School may require that I submit supporting documentation to prove my eligibility for a deferment. I may defer making scheduled installment payments and will not be liable for any interest that might otherwise accrue during any period that I am enrolled in a nursing program and attending as a regular student in at least a half-time course of study at an eligible school.

CANCELLATIONS - Upon making a properly documented written request to the School, I am entitled to have up to 100 percent of the original principal loan amount of this loan canceled if I perform qualifying service in the areas listed in paragraph A below. Qualifying service must be performed after I receive the loan.
A. Nurse • I am employed in a full-time position in the state of Nevada that requires licensure by the Nevada State Board of Nursing.

Cancellation Rates - For each completed year of service under paragraphs A, a portion of this loan will be canceled at the following rates:

- 15 percent of the original principal loan amount for each of the first and second years, plus any interest accrued for that portion of the loan; $\bullet 20$ percent of the original principal loan amount for each of the third year and fourth years plus any interest accrued for that portion of the loan; and • 30 percent of the original
principal loan amount for the fifth year plus any accrued interest remaining to bring the outstanding loan amount to zero. No cancellation credit will be given for partial years worked.

The School may cancel this loan if I die or become totally and permanently disabled. I understand and agree that I must provide documentation acceptable to the School of any claimed disability.
