RATIONALE FOR THE FEE:

The board rate is driven by three factors: overhead, per meal costs, and dining dollars. The current request for an increase is based on a 5% increase in the cost of food and an increase in dining dollars (actual money that can be spent in venues beyond the dining commons) requested by the students. We did not increase the overhead rate this year. In addition, we are requesting approval to increase the board rate each year by no more than 5%.

NAME OF FEE

International Student Fee

RATIONALE FOR THE FEE:

UNLV’s request is identical to a fee already charged to international students at UNR. International student enrollment requires the careful monitoring of students in accordance with the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services’ policies. Specialized services are necessary to support international students in their admission, visa status, advisement, legal status, and adjustment to the United States. The need for additional specialized staff and technical support to comply with immigration reporting requirements and admissions processes has increased the cost of admitting and retaining an international student. The result of SEVIS (the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System), implemented after 9/11, requires that we more closely track and monitor international students and report to the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services. In addition, new regulations regarding the issuing and reporting of I-20 documents, change of status, enrollment information and SEVIS reporting compliance require enhanced technology and a greater level of oversight by the university.

This fee will assist with the costs associated with tracking, advising, retaining, admitting, and providing support services to international students.

All enrolled international students (approximately 600 undergraduates, 300 graduate students).

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT FEE

1. Position Statement

The recruitment, admission and advising of international students represents a tremendous cost to the University of Nevada, Reno and University of Nevada, Las Vegas. The logistical and administrative burdens of international students on the university are complex and expensive. Increased costs of international mailing, phone, facsimile, recruitment, specialized printing, translations and highly trained personnel forces the university to make difficult budgetary choices. These choices often leave international students out of receiving the proper levels of attention.

Because of the limited resources of the Admissions and International Student Office, the need for funding aimed directly at the international students is essential. These funds will be directly used to support programs pertaining to international students. Additionally, it is not proper to use funds dedicated to benefit university students as a whole, to support activities that benefit only international students.

2. Resolve

International students will pay a \$100.00 per student, per semester, International Student Fee. The revenue for this will be used to sustain enrollment functions in the Admissions, Graduate, and International Student offices, supporting only international students.

Student Health Insurance

RATIONALE FOR THE FEE:

UNLV is currently negotiating rates with the health insurance providers. The rationale, number of students impacted, and handbook information will be brought forward to the board in summer.

NAME OF FEE

Graduation, Diploma or Certificate Fee, all programs

RATIONALE FOR THE FEE:

The fee supports costs associated with students’ degree completion and graduation: graduation applications, verification of completed degree requirements, student notifications, official diplomas, and commencement ceremony expenses that include facility rentals, programs and receptions.

The fee was last increased in 1993. Since that time, the number of students graduating annually from the University has increased 70 percent. The current fee structure does not support the general costs associated with verifying students’ degree completion, diploma costs, postage, processing materials, and labor costs. Also, the increased number of students graduating from the University has resulted with the need to expand the number of commencement ceremonies from one to three ceremonies each year.

NUMBER OF STUDENTS POTENTIALLY IMPACTED BY THE FEE:

Approximately 3,900 students apply for graduation annually.

Health Service

RATIONALE FOR THE FEE

The University is requesting to increase the fee by the most recently published CPI (1.8%) plus 1% as approved at the Board of Regents meeting in April 2001. The rationale for this increase includes the following:

- The number of students attending the University has increased substantially and patient visits to the Student Health Center have increased as well.
- The cost of medical supplies and equipment continues to increase at about 10% a year.
- Because of the changes in malpractice carriers at the School of Medicine, the Student Health Center had to change five physician salaries into state positions in 2002.
- By incorporating this small yearly increase, it will avoid having to request a large increase from the students.

RATIONALE FOR THE FEE

Increased fees for Independent Learning Program are requested due to increases in operating costs, including printing of course materials and supplies that have increased by 2%. The funding needed for staff salaries has also increased by an additional 5% due to staff merit, promotion, and increased insurance costs. Also, this increase will help cover the salary for the web course design team who is adding new semester-based online courses each semester. It is customary for IL to maintain at least a \$5 per credit differential between IL and on-campus per credit fee costs.

RATIONALE FOR THE FEE

The University requests approval of the 2004-05 premiums for the regular student insurance plan (UNR/TMCC/WNCC). It is standard practice for the Student Health Center to negotiate student health and accident insurance premiums (UNR/TMCC/WNCC students) every year. The current contract with Mega Health and Life expires August 31, 2004. After competitive bid, the Student Health Center is recommending that Mega Health and Life again be the carrier for student health and accident insurance.

Other options have been considered and this proposal represents the most economical option.

NUMBER OF STUDENTS POTENTIALLY IMPACTED BY THE FEE

Approximately 890 domestic students and 775 international students will be impacted by the increased premiums.

RATIONALE FOR THE FEE

The residence hall and food service rate request addresses room and board rates that were previously approved as part of the sale of the bonds for the Phases 1 and 2 of the new residence hall and dining facility. The increases have been rounded for ease in assessment, collection and distribution of charges.

A base increase in rates reflects a 5.7% average increase in meal plan costs due to inflation and consistency with CPI and enables payment toward bonded indebtedness for construction of the new dining facility. The increases fall within the range that has the unanimous approval of the Residence Hall Association.

Canada Hall is the primary choice of returning students and in order to compete with new, private construction in partnership with the University, no increase is requested for Canada Hall.

A base increase in rates reflects a 5% increase in Residence Hall rates and a 2.7% increase to the Summer Session Meal Plan rates due to inflation and consistency with CPI. A 1.7% increase to the Summer Conference Meal Plan rates enables payment toward bonded indebtedness.

Also a new program has been developed to address the specific needs of new conference business, i.e., summer sports festival participants. (See Section 2.e)
