# BOARD OF REGENTS BRIEFING PAPER

## **Handbook** Revision – Student Standing at Previous Institutions

#### BACKGROUND & POLICY CONTEXT OF ISSUE:

Existing Board policy provides that students transferring to a university or state college must be in good standing and eligible to return to the educational institution last attended (*Title 4, Chapter 16*, *Sections 9 and 28*). This provision is limited to the prior institution and does not clearly address situations where a student may have attended multiple institutions previously. Based on conversations with the Student Affairs Council, staff recommends that an additional provision be added to provide that transfer students at all NSHE institutions, including the colleges (which are not included in the current policy provisions) be authorized to consider a student's standing at any previously attended institution.

#### SPECIFIC ACTIONS BEING RECOMMENDED OR REQUESTED:

Amend Board policy (*Title 4, Chapter 16, Sections 9, 18 and 28*) to provide that when admitting a student, the institution may consider a student's standing at a previously attended institution, including but not limited to, records of disciplinary action. (See attached Policy Proposal.)

#### **IMPETUS (WHY NOW?):**

This matter is brought forward at the request of the Student Affairs Council who are seeking authority to consider a student's standing at any previously attended institution.

## BULLET POINTS TO SUPPORT REQUEST/RECOMMENDATION:

If approved as proposed, the policy will allow all NSHE institutions appropriately to consider a applicant's standing at all previously attended institutions to the extent that it is appropriate. The policy will grant institutions the discretion to investigate disciplinary issues at previously attended institutions.

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None have been brought forward.

#### ALTERNATIVE(S) TO WHAT IS BEING REQUESTED/RECOMMENDED:

Maintain the current policy as written where the policy is unclear whether standing at the last institution attended only would be considered in admitting students at the universities and state college or at all institutions previously

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# POLICY PROPOSAL TITLE 4, CHAPTER 16, SECTION 9

Transfer Students

## **Section 9.** University Transfer Students

- 1. Students transferring to a university must be in good standing and eligible to return to the educational institution last attended.
- 2. When admitting a student, the institution may consider the student's standing at a previously attended institution, including but not limited to, records of disciplinary action.
- 3. Students who have registered at other educational institutions may not disregard such records and make application on the basis of their high school or selected college transcripts only. Any student who does so is subject to cancellation from the university.
- [3]4. An ineligible applicant who gains admission to a university on the basis of incomplete or fraudulent credentials or misrepresentations in the written application for admission shall have their:
  - a. Admission and registration canceled without refund of any fees;
  - b. Total credits rescinded that have been earned following such admission; and
  - c. Future registration at an NSHE university is prohibited unless authorized on a case-by-case basis by the institution.
- [4]5. A student transferring from one campus to another within the Nevada System of Higher Education is required to submit an application for admission and supporting credentials directly to the institutionally designated office. Admission of the applicant and acceptance of transfer credits are governed by the advanced standing regulations of the institution to which the application is submitted and the Title 4, Chapter 14 provisions governing transfer and articulation.

# POLICY PROPOSAL TITLE 4, CHAPTER 16, SECTION 18

**Transfer Students**

## Section 18. <u>Community College Admission – General Policy</u>

- 1. In the admission of students, community colleges shall not discriminate on the basis of a person's age, disability, ethnicity, gender, national origin, race, religion, or sexual orientation.
- 2. All applicants must qualify for admission by satisfying at least one (1) of the following:
  - a.) at least 18 years of age;
  - b.) a graduate of a high school or its equivalent;
  - c.) a qualified high school student; or
  - d.) a qualified international student.
- 3. When admitting a student, the institution may consider the student's standing at a previously attended institution, including but not limited to, records of disciplinary action.
- 4. All applicants for admission shall complete such tests, furnish such information, and meet such deadlines as required by the regulations published in the admissions sections of the catalog governing the semester of initial enrollment. The initial semester of enrollment shall be considered the date of matriculation except where otherwise defined by the institution.
- [4]5. Admission to an NSHE community college implies general admission to the college only and does not constitute admission to a specific curriculum or courses that may require additional admission criteria, as published in the college catalog governing the semester of initial enrollment.
- [5]6. Programs designated as limited entry require fulfillment of selective admissions criteria as contained in the institutional catalog and other appropriate college documents. Continuation in selective admissions programs is likewise contingent upon fulfillment of conditions specified by the institution and contained in official institutional documents.

# POLICY PROPOSAL TITLE 4, CHAPTER 16, SECTION 28

# Section 28. State College - Admission to Advanced Standing

Admission with advanced undergraduate standing is granted to a student transferring from another accredited college or university provided that:

- 1. The applicant is in good standing and eligible to return to the educational institution last attended[; and].
- 2. An official transcript is presented to the state college showing an overall grade point average of 2.0 or above on all acceptable or transferable credits, provided that if less than 12 acceptable transfer credits are involved, freshman entrance requirements shall also be satisfied.
- 3. When admitting a student, the institution may consider the student's standing at a previously attended institution, including but not limited to, records of disciplinary action.
