BOARD OF REGENTS BRIEFING PAPER

1. Agenda Item Title: Handbook and Procedures & Guidelines Manual Revisions, Student Fees

Meeting Date: December 5 - 6, 2013

2. BACKGROUND & POLICY CONTEXT OF ISSUE:

P&G Chapter 7, Section 9 (Student Fees) and Section 10 (Special Course Fees) - The Board of Regents approves registration fees and tuition, student fees and special course fees per Board policy. The Board of Regents Handbook at Title 4, Chapter 17, Section 17, sets the conditions under which student fees may be assessed. The language of this section of the Handbook also requires that mandatory fees shall be reviewed and approved by the Board of Regents.

Similarly, the Board of Regents Handbook at Title 4, Chapter 17, Section 18, sets the conditions under which special course fees may be assessed. This section of the Handbook requires Board approval for all fees greater than \$50.00 per course and specifies the activities to which these fees apply.

Each of the proposed changes in student fees and in special course fees has been thoroughly considered at the campus level. In the process of considering changes to the fee structures, students at each of the campuses and at undergraduate and graduate levels as appropriate, have been involved in the fee committee deliberations.

The proposed changes in student fees that have been submitted by the campuses are presented in a format that includes information about the numbers of students affected by the proposed changes as well as information about the proposed changes in revenues associated with the proposed fee changes. The attached spreadsheets contain this information regarding proposed changes in student fees, proposed changes in special course fees, and proposed changes in Residence Hall and Food Service Rates.

The current full list of the Board approved Student Fees is also attached.

Additionally staff is recommending consideration of four policy changes at this time to clarify and streamline this section of Board policy:

P&G Chapter 7, Section 9A (Standard Student Fees) and Section 10 (Special Course Fees) – Amend sections to state "institutions can charge up to the amount approved." This request is made as a result of discussions by the Business Officers Council to allow institutions the capability of charging "up to" an approved amount. This change formalizes existing practice and specifically allows savings from certain one-time events (such as donations for class supplies, negotiated savings, etc) to be passed onto the students.

P&G Chapter 7, Section 9E (Special Building Fee, NSC) – Amend to state Teaching English as a Second Language (TESL) Endorsement Program is excluded from the special building fee at NSC. This is a unique endorsement program targeted to offsite working teachers, and as such this exclusion has been requested to clarify that these students are not subject to this fee.

Handbook Title 4, New Chapters 17 & 18 (Proposed Late Registration Fee and Late Payment Fee) – The current language in the Handbook governing student fees does not specifically address late fees. These additions in proposed Section 17 and Section 18 will formalize the circumstances that late registration and late payment fees may be charged, address maximum amounts, and provide for consistency across the System. Additionally, the proposed late registration fee language gives the institutions the ability to grant exceptions in circumstances of late registration that are beyond the student's control (such as new sections added after registration cut-off).

Handbook Title 4, Chapter 17 (Student Fees) – NSHE institutions often administer outside tests (ex: GED) for the convenience of the students, to maintain academic records, or for other academic program reasons. Often these tests have a pass-through fee associated with them. While that pass-through fee is collected and remitted to the testing body, there can be an administrative cost associated with providing the exams. The proposed addition clarifies that this administrative fee may be charged; however (consistent with other fees outlined in this section) the revenue generated can only be used to offset the actual expense associated with the specific activity – in this case the test administration.

All fees proposed in the agenda will be effective in the fall 2014 semester.

Vice Chancellor for Finance and Administration Vic Redding requests approval of proposed Handbook changes and special fee and student fee changes for NSHE institutions, with fees to be effective 2014-2015.

To allow for appropriate planning for the upcoming 2014-2015 academic year.

5. BULLET POINTS TO SUPPORT REQUEST/RECOMMENDATION:

- To allow programs to be offered in the coming year.
- To allow class costs to be covered.

6. POTENTIAL ARGUMENTS AGAINST THE REQUEST/RECOMMENDATION:

Fee increases may make it more difficult for students to meet financial obligations.

To reduce the number of programs and/or level of service and support for campus services.

 - b. Late Payment Fee: A late payment fee of up to \$25 may be assessed for payments received after the payment deadline. An additional fee of up to \$25 may be assessed daily after the payment deadline up to \$250 for past due balances greater than \$100.

EXECTUIVE SUMMARY OF FEE INCREASES

Section 10. Special Course Fees

It is the policy of the Board of Regents that the registration fee be the only fee assessed for taking a course except as outlined in this section. The reasons for these exceptions are extraordinary instruction costs due to: (a) individual instruction (e.g., private music lessons), (b) class supplies, course-specific software, and specialized equipment (e.g., welding equipment and materials), (c) third party charges for use of a facility (e.g., golf), (d) special transportation requirements, or (e) extraordinary instructional costs (e.g., intensive supervision, support or additional technical expertise required for the delivery of the course), (f) some combination of these reasons. Responsibility for implementing this policy is delegated to the presidents up to a maximum of \$50.00 per course. Courses requiring fees higher than \$50.00 require Board of Regents approval and are as follows *(institutions may charge up to the amount approved)*:

B. <u>INTERNATIONAL STUDENT FEE</u>

The recruitment, admission and advising of international students represents a tremendous cost to the University of Nevada, Reno, and University of Nevada, Las Vegas. The logistical and administrative burdens of international students on the university are complex and expensive. Increased costs of international mailing, phone, facsimile, recruitment, specialized printing, translations and highly trained personnel forces the university to make difficult budgetary choices. These choices often leave international students short of receiving the proper levels of attention.

Because of the limited resources of the Admissions and International Student Office, the need for funding aimed directly at the international students is essential. These funds will be directly used to support programs pertaining to international students. Additionally, it is not proper to use funds dedicated to benefit university student as a whole, to support activities that benefit only international students.

International students will pay a semester International Student Fee. The revenue from this fee will be used to sustain enrollment functions in the Admissions, Graduate, and International Student offices, supporting only international students.

C. STUDENT LIFE FACILITIES FEE, UNLV

The following fee shall support the planning, construction, and operations of a new student recreation center and a renovation and expansion of the Moyer Student Union. All students have access to the Moyer Student Union. Students required to pay the fee will have full access to the recreation center; students taking three or fewer credits during fall or spring will be required to pay a user fee in order to use the Student Recreation Center; this fee will be 125% of the fee charged those student taking more than three credits.

Section 10. Special Course Fees

It is the policy of the Board of Regents that the registration fee be the only fee assessed for taking a course except as outlined in this section. The reasons for these exceptions are extraordinary instruction costs due to: (a) individual instruction (e.g., private music lessons), (b) class supplies, course-specific software, and specialized equipment (e.g., welding equipment and materials), (c) third party charges for use of a facility (e.g., golf), (d) special transportation requirements, or (e) extraordinary instructional costs (e.g., intensive supervision, support or additional technical expertise required for the delivery of the course), (f) some combination of these reasons. Responsibility for implementing this policy is delegated to the presidents up to a maximum of \$50.00 per course. Courses requiring fees higher than \$50.00 require Board of Regents approval and are as follows (institutions may charge up to the amount approved):

POLICY PROPOSAL - *HANDBOOK*TITLE 4 /, CHAPTER 17/, NEW SECTIONS 17-18, SECTION 17/

Section 17. Late Registration Fee

A late registration fee of up to \$50 per course may be assessed to students who don't meet the course registration deadline. Late registration fee exceptions may be granted by the Institution when registration was delayed due to circumstances beyond the student's control.

Section 18. Late Payment Fee

A late payment fee of up to \$25 may be assessed for payments received after the payment deadline. An additional fee of up to \$25 may be assessed daily after the payment deadline up to \$250 for past due balances greater than \$100.

[Section 17] Section 19. Student Fees

- 1. It is the policy of the Board of Regents that Student Fees exist only in cases of additional administrative or other service costs incurred by the institution for a necessary student activity or requirement that are not specific to one course or type of course. Student Fees may be assessed to provide services to the students for:
 - (a) special events or activities such as graduation,
 - (b) special services provided by the institution such as personal/group counseling including psychological and testing, substance abuse counseling, health services, international student services,
 - (c) third party pass-through charges such as test administration, certifications or contracted health services. An additional administrative charge of up to \$25 may be added to the pass-through cost.
 - (d) special general instructional requirements such as a thesis fee.

Funds generated from Student Fees *pursuant to this section* may be spent on the intended purpose only. Mandatory fees required of all students or all students in a particular group, regardless of dollar amount, shall be reviewed and approved by the Board of Regents.

2. Transcript fees do not require Board approval and shall be in an amount that does not exceed the cost of producing the transcript plus postage, including costs for expedited delivery. The cost of production may include salary and other employee costs associated with production.
