iNtegrate Phase II

The objective of the iNtegrate project is to implement a new set of software modules, collectively called an Enterprise Resource Planning solution, to serve the business functions of NSHE – Student Services, Financial Services and Human Resource Services. Phase 1 of the iNtegrate project consists of implementing the Campus Solutions Student Information System components.

Implementing a full ERP system is a significant project, spanning several years and requiring a substantial budget. In February 2010, finance and budget business leaders from all NSHE institutions participated in a process for initial planning for implementation of the project’s Financial Services components.

Sponsored by the NSHE Council of Business Officers and the iNtegrate Project Director, Oracle consultants facilitated their ‘Insight’ process to assist NSHE in gathering and analyzing data and business processes to identify the business drivers for the ERP strategy, to develop a high level strategic roadmap, and to articulate the value of a new solution from qualitative and quantitative perspective.

The report concluded that NSHE has a unique and strategically significant opportunity to collectively (system-wide) and collaboratively develop a best in class functional operating model, which can create efficiencies and effectiveness by consolidating and standardizing processes and technology.

At the December 2, 2010 Board of Regents meeting, the Investments and Facilities Committee earmarked \$20 million to invest in future iNtegrate phases for Grants & Contracts, Financials Services and Human Resource solutions. As planning moves forward, the iNtegrate Project Office will provide specific budget information to the Board of Regents.

Oracle Briefing

On October 21, 2010, NSHE, SCS, the iNtegrate Project Office, and CedarCrestone consultants participated in a day long Executive Briefing at Oracle’s Conference Center in Redwood City, California. Senior Directors and other key leaders from Oracle’s Product and Services divisions provided the group with information on the Strategic Direction of PeopleSoft Student, Financial and Human Capital Management solutions, as well as PeopleSoft Procurement software and On-Demand Services.

Information gained will help with planning future phases of iNtegrate and for developing process and schedules for new software release updates for PeopleSoft Campus Solutions.



iNtegrate in the Classroom
